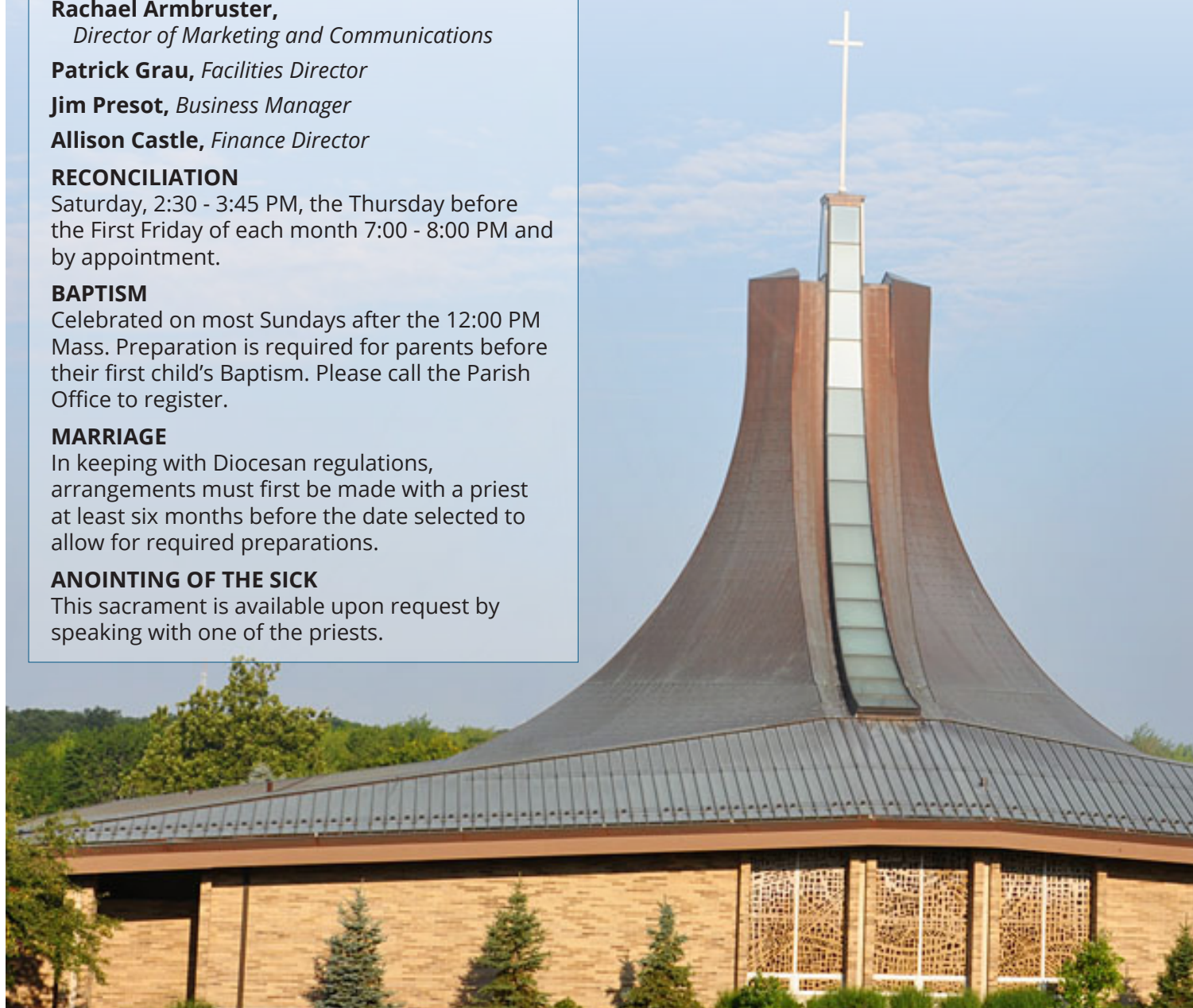

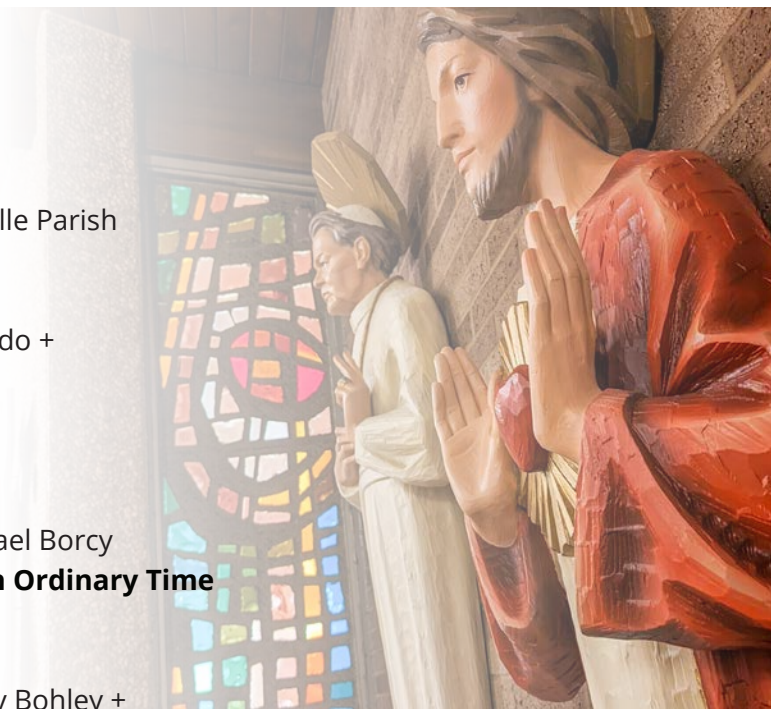

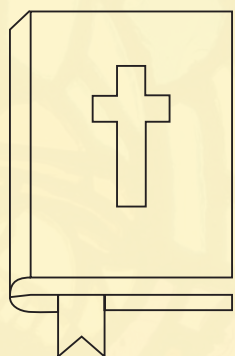

## LETTER FROM THE PASTOR



### ST. LUKE THE EVANGELIST, PRAY FOR US!

On Saturday, October 18th, we celebrate the Feast Day of St. Luke the Evangelist. Luke was the author of the 3rd Gospel, a companion of St. Paul and the letter to the Colossians mentions Luke as a physician (from the Greek word meaning “one who heals”). In the Middle Ages, Luke was regarded as the patron saint of doctors, nurses, and those in the medical profession.

St. Luke came from Antioch, and was a practicing doctor when he was converted by St. Paul. He attached himself to the Apostle Paul and accompanied him on most of his missionary journeys and was still with him in Rome when St. Paul was in prison awaiting death. We hear no more of him afterward and nothing is known of his last years.

Because of his closeness with St. Paul, Luke acquired the information about the life of the early Christian communities, which he recorded in the Acts of the Apostles, from St. Paul’s teaching and a study of all our Lord’s life. To St. Luke’s Gospel we owe most of our knowledge of Christ’s childhood and some precious details about our Lady. Luke’s Gospel is principally concerned with salvation and mercy. He also preserved some of the most touching of our Lord’s parables, for example those of the lost sheep and the prodigal son.

Each of the four Gospel writers are represented by a symbol from the prophet Ezekiel. Among the four animals of Ezekiel’s vision, the winged ox represents St. Luke because oxen were associated with the Old Testament priesthood and were offered as sacrifices in the Temple of Jerusalem. The winged ox of Ezekiel’s vision, taken by Christian art as a symbol of the third Evangelist, recalls for us the stable of Bethlehem and the details of the hidden life which Mary pondered in her heart and Luke reveals to us in his Gospel. At St. Columbkille, if you look at the illuminated manuscript carved in wood and taken from the Book of Kells painted on the front of the Ambo (lectern where the Scriptures are proclaimed) you will see St. Luke painted as a winged ox.

### THE SECRET OF THE ROSARY BY SAINT LOUISE DE MONTFORT!

October is the month dedicated to Our Lady of the Rosary. Here is one of my favorite reflections from St. Louise de Montfort on why praying the Rosary is so spiritually powerful. Having decided to ask Saint Dominic’s advice about her spiritual life, she asked him to hear her confession. For penance he gave her one whole Rosary to say and advised her to say it every day. She said that she had not time to say it, excusing herself on the grounds that she made the Stations of the Cross in Rome every day, that she wore sack-cloth and also a hair shirt, that she gave herself the discipline several times a week, that she carried out so many other penances and fasted so much. Saint Dominic urged her over and over again to take his advice and say the Rosary, but she would not hear of it. She left the confessional, horrified at the tactics of this new spiritual director who had tried so hard to persuade her to take on a devotion that was not at all to her liking.

Later on when she was in prayer, she fell into ecstasy and had a vision of her soul appearing before Our Lord’s Judgment Seat. Saint Michael put all her penances and other prayers onto one balance of the scales and all her sins and imperfections onto the other. The tray of her good works was greatly outweighed by that of her sins and imperfections. Filled with terror she cried for mercy, imploring the help of the Blessed Virgin, her gracious Advocate, who took the one and only Rosary that she had said for her penance and dropped it onto the tray of good works. This one Rosary was so heavy that it weighed more than all her sins as well as all her good works. Our Lady then reproved her for having refused to follow the counsel of her servant Dominic and for not saying the Rosary every day.

As soon as she came to herself, she rushed and threw herself at the feet of Saint Dominic and told him all that had happened, begged his forgiveness for her unbelief and promised to say the Rosary faithfully every day. By this means she rose to Christian perfection and finally to the glory of everlasting life. *When you say your Rosary, the angels rejoice, the Blessed Trinity delights in it, my Son finds joy in it too, and I myself am happier than you can possibly guess. After the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, there is nothing in the Church that I love as much as the Rosary.*

### BLESSED BE GOD WHO HEALS US IN CHRIST!

In Psalm 121 this weekend, we hear proclaimed, “Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth.” God actively wants to help us and heal us through the Sacraments of the Church. God wants to bring healing to our minds, bodies, and spirits...we need only invite the Lord into our pain and suffering and Jesus will begin to work on us, casting out darkness and dispelling fear. We have a tremendous gift in the Church called the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick that is often overlooked by many Catholics because they believe it is only for the terminally ill. It is important not to wait until you are dying to receive the Anointing of the Sick.



## LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Formerly called “extreme unction” or “last rites,” Anointing of the Sick is administered to those who are seriously ill, undergoing surgery, recovering from surgery, anyone who is of advanced age in a weak condition, sick children who have sufficient use of reason, or anyone who is suffering serious ailments of mind, body, or spirit. Anointing isn’t just for the dying; the Church stresses the effects of the sacrament: namely the forgiveness of sins and to help a person recover from ill health. Anointing of the Sick may be received more than once should a person’s health situation change. When received in faith, Anointing of the Sick provides the recipient with strength to heal physically, mentally and spiritually through deep union with the Passion of Christ.

**The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be given by Fr. Suso and Fr. Spicer immediately after all our weekend Masses this weekend, October 18th-19th. Anyone wishing to be anointed is invited to come forward in the center Communion line to one of our priests after the recessional hymn has concluded.** For those with mobility issues, one of our priests will be available to come to you in the pew, simply raise your hand and we will come to you. Blessed be God who heals us in Christ.

Never forget, the Lord is with us, always!

# PARISH NEWS



In today's Gospel, we hear Jesus encourage us to persevere in prayer by challenging our doubt: "Will [God] be slow to answer...?" Struggle is real and common to us all. But consistent struggle that seems to remain, no matter the number of times we pray, strikes at the heart of our suffering. We ask "When will I be heard?" This is particularly apparent when the suffering comes from wounds inflicted by others. "Where does my help come from?" the psalmist asks. Help comes from leaning into the wound and inviting the One who promises to heal to enter into it with us. The widow in today's parable demonstrated this: she sought

justice (leaned into her wound) and then invited the judge to acknowledge it until she prevailed. We, too, must notice our wounds and then implore the Just Judge who promises to "...secure the rights of his chosen ones who call out to him day and night." We may not find relief in the act of persevering – but we will find peace in the entering in with Jesus who is Peace and in His promise to respond to our perseverance.

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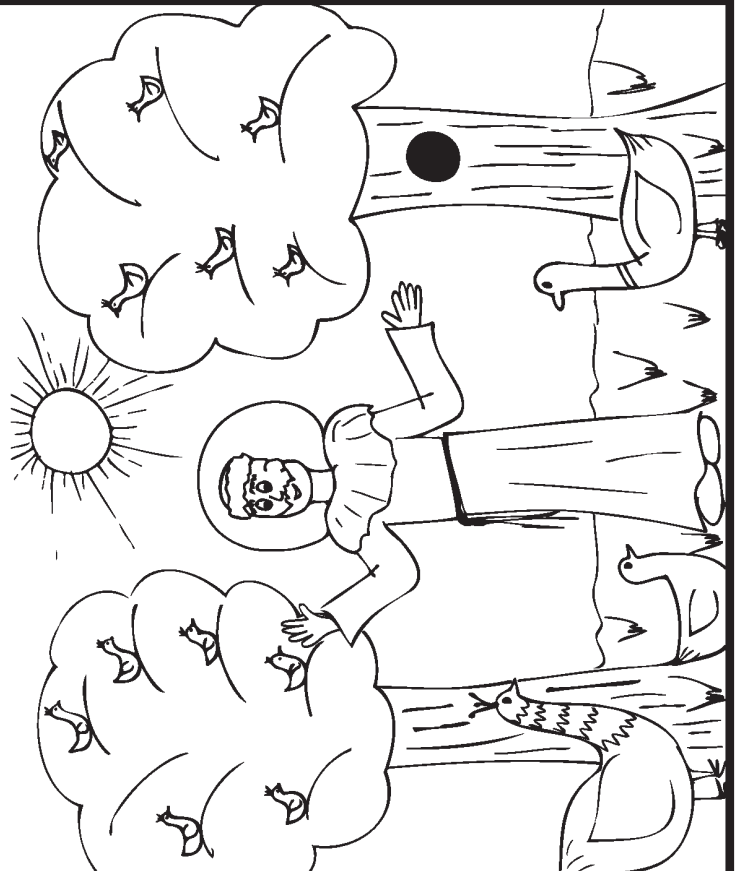

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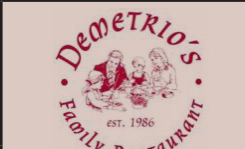


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
