He was hit on a Friday night and on Sunday morning they were at church. The poor little guy had road rash from his lips all the way to his ear plus all over his arms and legs. His dad told me that they were going to stay home and let him rest, but Chris insisted that they go to church that morning. He didn't want to miss out. Praise God that he still is in the miracle business today!

We had a men's workshop on the Saturday before Father's Day and it was very well attended. A preacher friend came from the Netherlands and another one came down from Gent to preach to us. We have been focusing all May and June on the family. That Saturday we preached about being the man that God wants us to be, and being the leader and father that our family needs us to be. Our street preaching signs in French came in and we went out and used them right away. Except the one lady who literally barked at me when I offered her a tract! Even though she looked normal, she was crazy; she actually made me jump. I thought about asking her if she had her rabies shots, but I decided that probably wouldn't really help the situation even though I so badly wanted to say it.

Thank you for all that you do for us, we know that it is a tough time economically and we are so grateful for your sacrifices for us, we don't deserve them but we are thankful.
