Trip to Asia

Earlier this year, the Lord allowed me to travel to parts of Asia to visit several translation works. The process of translating the Word of God into another language is both tedious and time-consuming. Along with it being a huge commitment with a tremendous amount of challenges and difficulties, it is also an invitation for spiritual warfare. This reality only heightened the amount of respect I have for the translators.

As we sat with each of them, I was so encouraged by their faithfulness and dedication. Word by word, verse by verse, they persevered with joy. Along with the tremendous mental weight of translation work itself, comes physical and financial strains as well as normal family issues and sometimes political oppression. These choice servants of the Lord battle every day, though often gaining little ground. Regardless, they move on, knowing every step brings a People Group closer to holding a copy of God's Word in their hands! As each translator told their story, I was reminded of all the stories that could be told from people here, who have given their resources and have made sacrifices financially so the Bible can be published and given freely all over the world.

From Translation to Printing

We have been raising funds for several languages over the past few years. For three of these languages, we are in the final stages:

- The Kom New Testament has been printed, bound, and shipped. Anticipation is building as we expect its arrival at the target destination in a couple of months.
- The Vaiphei Bible is in the binding stage. We rejoice to see the completion of this Bible!
- The Zou Bible is also in the binding stage. We are providing 9,000 hardback and 1,000 leather-like covers for each of these Bibles. We hope to have this shipment ready in a couple of months.


Liberia, West Africa
