The Season of Creation is an Ecumenical initiative supported by the World Council of Churches and by many Christian Charities, including SCIAF, CAFOD, Christian Aid and Laudato Si.

It runs from 1st September-4th October, The Feast of St Francis of Assisi; and the theme this year is this verse from the prophet Amos 'Let Justice and Peace Flow'.

This is a perfect time for parishes to re-assess their environmental responsibilities, commitments, and actions; and to plan together for local initiatives that will benefit the environment and support vulnerable people, animals and plants.

It's also a great opportunity for ecumenical outreach—to collaborate with other local churches—and all people of good will—so that we are united in this great mission to protect and save our planet.

Participation in the Synodal Journey, started by Pope Francis in 2020, has been a crucial part of the Scottish Laity Network's mission since the very beginning of our Journey of Discernment in 2020. We have embraced dialogue and opportunities for discussion as part of a new way of BEING CHURCH.

We gathered feedback from our members during and after our webinars and organised these into our response to the initial Synod Process, representing the views we have heard from members. You can read this document on our website here.

We have also taken part in the worldwide response to the Continental stage of the synod and formulated a response, again based on the conversations we have had with our companions and members. This is also available on our website here.





We are currently finalising feedback from our members' responses to the INSTRUMENTUM LABORIS Document, which will form the framework for discussions of the worldwide church representatives in Rome in October.

Spirit Unbounded members will be participating in the October synod in two exciting ways. Firstly, some representative of the group will be actually in Rome at the time of the Synod, attending a programme of talks by eminent speakers from all around the world. (Live events 13-14th October)

Secondly, Spirit Unbounded have also organised a synchronized event in Bristol at the same time as

the Rome Synod, for which places can be booked in advance (in person and online) on their website <u>here.</u> The Bristol event will take place from 8th to 14th October and speakers include Dr Mary McAleese, Sr Joan Chittister and Steven Newcomb.

SLN and LOUDfence

As part of our Signs of the Spirit Pentecost series we welcomed Antonia Sobocki, the project manager of LOUDfence, the survivors' charity, as one of our companions. Antonia impressed all of us so much with her commitment, enthusiasm and most of all with her compassion and courage. You can watch her presentation again

Antonia's LOUDfence idea has been adopted in several dioceses in England and in France and we talked together about her bringing the project to Scotland.

She was invited to bring LOUDfence to the installation of the new Bishop of Hexham and Newcastle,

Stephen Wright, on July 19th, where ribbons of remembrance and support were tied to Bishop Wright's cathedra chair; and he gave an invitation to Maggie **Matthews from Root and Branch to** speak freely about her experience as an abuse survivor. This was a significant and very moving event.



The day after the enthronement. Antonia travelled up to Glasgow in Scotland to meet members of the SLN Core Group, Gemma Lamarra, Frank Quinn and Anne Dobbing.

We discussed the feasibility of bringing LOUDfence to Scotland and have provisionally agreed that SLN and LOUDfence with collaborate to organize an event in Oban next year during Lent. Details to follow.
