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
Snapshot of B.C. Seniors

Snapshot of B.C. Seniors



95% aged 65+ live independently

o **77% at** 85+



24% aged 65+ live alone

o **39%** at 85+



9% aged 85+ live in assisted living

13% aged 85+ live in long-term care



88% have driver's license at age 65

- 58% at age 85
- o **40%** at 85+



80% aged 65+ are homeowners



6% aged 65+ diagnosed with dementia

- 3% aged 65-84
- 20% aged 85+

Challenges to Healthy Aging



- Costs
 - Physical and cognitive function
 - Geography
 - Family
- Fragmented systems
- Ageism rights of autonomy, right to live at risk

Costs of Aging

- Median seniors income is \$32,990
 - 25% of seniors live on less than \$22,000

- Long-term care




Cost of Home Support vs. Long-Term Care




