BAPTISM GUIDELINES

- 1. Requests for infant Baptism must be made one month in advance.
- 2. The family must be registered with the parish.
- 3. First-time parents must attend a baptismal class. A baptismal packet must also be filled out (obtain in office).
- 4. Baptism of older children and adults must be preceded by instruction.
- 5. The godparents must be at least 16 years old. One of the godparents must be Catholic who has received all of the sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation). The Catholic godparent(s) must be committed and active in their faith and parish communities, in harmony with the Catholic Church. If the godparents' parish of record is other than St. Michael's, they must fill out a sponsor form and return it to the parish office. See more information here: stmichaelwaterloo.com/baptism

DIOCESAN "SAFE ENVIRONMENT (S.E.)" POLICIES

The Diocese of Fort Wayne-South Bend has established policies for the protection of children and young people. It has become necessary for all parishes to have volunteers fill out an application with references, agree to a limited background check, and complete the online S.E. training before working with our youth. All information is kept confidential by the Safe Environment Coordinator (SEC). Thank you for your cooperation in helping us ensure the protection of our children!

SACRAMENTAL GUIDELINES FOR ADULT CONFIRMATION

- 1. Intended for adults who were Baptized as Catholics, but not Confirmed during adolescence.
- 2. Requirements include: asking a Sponsor (at least 16 years of age and a Catholic in good standing), being properly instructed in the Faith, and being properly disposed by having received Reconciliation and Holy Communion prior to Confirmation.
- 3. Confirmed by Bishop Usually held in May each year at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Fort Wayne.

EXPLORING THE CATHOLIC FAITH – R.C.I.A.

Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) is open to any adult in the parish who would like to learn more about the Catholic Church, whether you are already Catholic or not. These classes are held on the second and third Sundays of the month at 9:00 am in the Parish Office. During Lent, they meet every week through Palm Sunday.

SACRAMENTAL GUIDELINES FOR MARRIAGE

Catholics hold that a valid marriage is one performed by a priest in good standing, in the presence of two witnesses, and in a parish church. The priest will help properly prepare the couple and make sure all is done to have it blessed by the Church.

Couples seeking marriage at St. Michael's are expected to not live together before the sacrament. If a couple is living together, then it is expected that they live separately for at least the 6-month period of preparation before their marriage.

Persons asking to have their marriage here must be active and participating Catholic parishioners for at least 6 months before scheduling the wedding. The wedding date is only set by contacting the Parish Office.

Marriage preparation includes several meetings with the priest and/or director of adult faith, attending the Engaged Encounter retreat (required by the diocese), and Natural Family Planning (NFP) classes. See more information here: stmichaelwaterloo.com/marriage

Religious Ed. Curriculum

The pre-school and Kindergarten classes use <u>Allelu!</u>, by Our Sunday Visitor (OSV). It is Christ-centered, and focuses on the same seven catechetical themes as the elementary curriculum, <u>Alive in Christ</u> by OSV. The themes are Revelation, Trinity, Jesus Christ, the Church, Sacraments, Morality, and the Kingdom of God in an ageappropriate manner. In addition, the Confirmation class uses <u>Theology of the Body</u> by Ascension, as mandated by the Diocese.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION FOR FIRST RECONCILIATION, FIRST COMMUNION & CONFIRMATION

Guidelines

- 1. The student must attend religious ed. for one year prior to sacramental prep. Confirmation students must attend 6th grade prior to beginning the two-year Confirmation prep cycle (Confirmation is held every other year).
- 2. Students wishing to receive these sacraments must fill out an application before preparation begins. Please return completed applications to Mrs. Swygart.
- 3. Students must attend classes on a regular basis. Absences must be made up.
- 4. Parental involvement is a very important part of sacramental prep. Sponsor involvement is also very important for Confirmation prep.
- 5. Students are expected to fulfill the obligations of preparation for the reception of each sacrament. More information can be found at stmichaelwaterloo.com/eucharist and stmichaelwaterloo.com/confirmation.

First Reconciliation and Communion

<u>Dates</u> – A parent information letter containing all dates will go home with students during the first month of the R.E. school year. First Communion will be Sunday, May 3, 2020 at the 10:30 a.m. Mass.

<u>Dress code</u> – First Communicants are modest and reverent in dress to receive Our Lord for the first time. Information sheets will go home with parents containing the dress code.

<u>Prayer Lambs</u> – The Prayer Lamb Program pairs adult parishioners with children who are preparing to receive the sacraments of First Reconciliation and Communion. An adult or a couple may sponsor a child. Adults send notes of prayer to their First Communicants throughout the school year, sit with them at the designated Prayer Lamb Mass, and more. Prayer Lambs will be assigned during the month of October. Please contact Mrs. Swygart if you'd like to be a Prayer Lamb.

Confirmation

Confirmation will be held Sunday, August 25, 2019 at the 10:30 am Mass. A new two-year Confirmation prep cycle will begin Sunday, September 8, 2019. Newly confirmed 8th graders will complete the second required year of the prep cycle. Newly confirmed 9th graders will advance to Life Teen (the R.E. program for high school).

LIFE TEEN CURRICULUM

Life Teen's curriculum is spread over 8 semesters (4 years of high school) and covers these Main Areas: Person of Christ, Paschal Mystery, Morality, Church, Social Justice, Sacraments, Vocations, Sacred Scripture, and Prayer. Confirmation marks a beginning of deepening of our faith. Confirmation should never mark an end to religious education. When students attend all 4 years of Life Teen, they receive a well-rounded education, giving them knowledge, tools, and experience necessary for life after high school – whether that be college, military, or workforce.

YOUTH GROUP

Youth Group (YG) is a dynamic and active group under the direction of the Youth Minister, Jenny Buchs. The group meets on a variety of days, depending on the nature of the activity. It is open to all students in grades 6-12 (this service and social group is separate from the R.E. program). Families should watch the weekly church bulletins and the "Salt Shaker" newsletter for current dates and details.
