We are writing to share an update on the children's recent assessment scores. These assessments help us understand their current progress and identify where further support may be needed as we continue through the year.

Please note that the national expectation for the end of Year 6 is a *scaled score of 100 or above* in Reading, Maths and Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling (GPS) in order to meet the expected standard in the KS2 SATs. Children are **not expected to be achieving a score of 100 at this point in the year**. Instead, the assessments completed now help us monitor their development and ensure they are on track for the end-of-year goals.

We will continue to support the children through targeted teaching and regular practice, and we appreciate your continued encouragement at home. If you have any questions about your child's progress, please feel free to get in touch.
