




Helen Almond Award Winner - Ted G

What inspired you to make a charitable contribution to the Routes organization?

I have worked in community and disability services/advocacy for over 30 years. I have personal connections and "chosen family" who have used and benefit regularly from Routes services including their volunteer drivers for special appointments.

Why is fostering connection important to you, especially in the context of building community?

Being isolated, vulnerable or marginalized in todays society can be debilitating for someone. A small act of kindness or support can be a game changer for someone that feels lost in a world that has forgotten to be kind and look after each other. With my small counselling office in Sutton and my volunteer outreach with the homeless, I see and witness the stories of people that are struggling, have been tossed aside or forgotten by those around them. We need to do better! If we can build community connections its a win-win for everyone involved.
