TWK Campus Construction Update

Dear Friends, Trustees, and Supporters,

We are excited to share progress from the TWK Campus construction journey. With your support and encouragement, we are steadily transforming our vision of a vibrant learning environment into reality.

Phase 1 - Completed!

On 25th April, we broke ground with a joyful ceremony marking the start of Phase 1. In just four months, we successfully completed:

- The Community Learning Centre (CLC) housing:
 - Reception office
 - > Two administrative offices
 - Meeting room
 - Community learning hall with store
 - Digital literacy room
 - Cleaners' store
 - > Ladies', men's and PWD washrooms








- Two classrooms (Grade 1 & 2)
 - An ablution block with washrooms for girls, boys, and PWDs







This milestone set the foundation for our vision and provided a safe, welcoming space for our learners and the community.


Phase 2 - Ongoing

Launched in early July, Phase 2 focuses on expanding the primary section. Expected completion is late November and includes:

- > PP1 & PP2 classrooms
- ➤ Grades 3 to 6 classrooms
- Junior Secondary School (Grades 7, 8 & 9)
- > Ablution block with inclusive washrooms







Still Needed:

While great progress has been made, some vital facilities in this phase remain out of reach due to limited funds; like a science lab to spark discovery, a library to nurture a love for reading, a digital room to connect learners to the world, and a special classroom to ensure children with disabilities learn with dignity. These are the heartbeats of a complete school, and we hope to bring them to life soon.



Phase 3 - Housing Units Underway

To support staff and create sustainable income for the school, we began Phase 3 in early July. Out of 20 planned units, 4 are under construction (two 2-bedroom units and one duplex of 1-bedroom units). Completion is expected by end of October.



To attract and retain qualified teachers, it's important to provide safe and comfortable housing within the school. Having staff accommodated on site not only reduces travel challenges in this remote area but also ensures teachers are available to support learners beyond class time & creating a stronger, more connected school community.

Out of the 20 planned housing units, only 4 are under construction. The remaining 16 are yet to be built due to funding limitations, leaving a big gap in our goal to fully accommodate teachers and strengthen the school community.

Site Achievements Beyond Classrooms

Infrastructure & Sustainability

Alongside building classrooms and housing, we have also achieved key infrastructure milestones:

- > Secure fencing: Concrete posts, insulated chain-link, and green-coated razor wire.
- ➤ Water security: An operational borehole with a yield of 9.8 m³/day, powered by solar and a water tower.
- Sustainability: A 20,000L biodigester is already in place, turning all school human waste into clean energy. It will produce about 2kg of LPG (methane) daily & ready to fuel the kitchen once built. The remaining slurry will be safely treated, ensuring a non-polluted and environmentally friendly school compound.





What's Next?

Our journey is still unfolding. The next priorities are building a Kitchen & Refectory Hall to provide nutritious meals and host community gatherings, a School Administration Block to strengthen governance, and completing critical facilities like the science lab, library, digital literacy room, and special needs classroom. Looking ahead, we also envision a TVET Centre to equip young people with practical skills for work and self-reliance—nurturing the next generation of empowered youth.

Thank You & Call to Action

Every brick laid and every classroom built is thanks to your generosity and belief in this vision. We invite you to continue walking with us as we equip classrooms with furniture and digital tools, build the much-needed science lab, library, and special needs classroom, and complete the kitchen and refectory hall to fully utilize the biodigester system. We also look forward to equipping the Community Learning Centre to empower elders with literacy and digital skills they missed in their youth, and establishing a TVET Centre to nurture our young people with practical skills for work and self-reliance.
