What should I expect from my funeral director?

- * Patience with special effort to explain all service options and prices.
- * Knowledge, honesty, sincerity as he or she works with my family to create a meaningful tribute to my loved one.

What items should I bring to the arrangement conference?

- * **Photos** - Bring several photos to choose from for the obituary and cosmetology purposes.
- * **Clothing, cosmetics, jewelry, glasses/dentures and other personal items** - including undergarments. Bring jewelry, cosmetics, nail polish, and other personal items. Opt for long sleeved outfits with closed necklines. Cosmetics will be discarded after use.
- * **Military discharge forms** (DD 214, report of separation) in order to file for military benefits.
- * **General information** - about the deceased such as his or her date and place of birth, home address, father's name, mother's maiden name, details pertaining to job, education and marital status, etc.
- * **Social Security Number** - As a courtesy West will notify the Social Security Administration about the death on your behalf. We also need the social security number for the death certificate.
- * **Insurance policies** - We can assist you with filing for benefits.
- * **Cemetery Paperwork (if applicable)**- Other than West Memorial Park, Clark's Chapel or Sky View.

What will we do while we are together today?

Our staff will accommodate your immediate needs. While we normally complete the arrangement process in about two hours, the amount of time we spend together is highly dependent upon your needs. We usually accomplish the following while together:

- * Determine the date, location, and type of services to be held.
- * Select a casket, vault, urn, cremation container, stationery, and other desired items.
- * Collect and confirm obituary and vital information.
- * Prepare and present a statement of funeral goods and services.
- * Provide choices related to payment. Note: If you plan to use insurance to pay for funeral expenses, please bring your policy(s) with you to the conference.
- * Complete a Cremation Authorization form, if cremation is selected.

A columbarium is a place for the respectful placement of cremated remains. A columbarium could be for just one person's cremated remains, however usually there are a number of cremated remains in one columbarium. Within each columbarium there are small spaces called a niche. That is where the urn holding the cremated remains are placed. They can be glass front which is usually within a building, or granite front which is usually outdoors.

The pictures on the previous page and on top of this page are columbaria we have at **West Memorial Park**. As you can see they are granite front, and in our cemetery the entire structure is made of granite, insuring the strongest, most durable building in the market place. Names, dates & even a photo may be placed on the front of these niches.

You will also notice from the photos that we have a **beautiful waterfall** adding to the peaceful and tranquil setting of the cemetery.

Caskets

The casket selection process is a very personal decision, and an important element in arranging or planning a funeral. Not only does the casket serve as one of the focal points of the funeral service, it can also reflect the deceased's personality and specific tastes.

Caskets are available in two major types of materials: metal and wood. Metal caskets are known for their strength and durability as well as their unique finishes. Metal caskets are available in bronze, copper, stainless steel or steel.

Bronze caskets offer the very finest in materials, workmanship, permanence and durability. They will not rust and are considered by many to be the ultimate in quality as far as metal caskets are concerned.



Bronze caskets are the most expensive type of metal caskets and are available for those families desiring the best quality.

Copper caskets are naturally resistant to corrosion. They are available in different styles and finishes, including a variety of painted finishes as well as a brushed finish, which allows the beauty of the copper to be exposed.

Stainless steel is a manmade material composed of steel, chromium and nickel, which is naturally corrosion resistant. Stainless steel caskets are available in painted or brushed finishes.

Steel caskets are available in a number of different styles and painted finishes. The cost is primarily determined by the thickness of the steel, the interior material and the exterior finish. The heaviest steel used is 16 gauge with 20 gauge being the lightest.



Wood caskets are available in mahogany, cherry, walnut, oak, poplar, pecan and pine. Many families feel that hardwood caskets offer a natural warmth, beauty and uniqueness that cannot be duplicated in metal caskets. The price difference in wood caskets will depend on the type of wood used, the interior materials, such as velvet or crepe and the craftsmanship of construction.

Mahogany wood is popular for its wide board widths, dark color, and beautiful grain and texture. It is also a highly durable hardwood. Besides being famous for its beauty and quality, mahogany is less widely available than other types of wood.

Oak is renowned for its highly recognizable graining pattern, making it a favorite of many families.

All of these natural materials are all known for their strength and classic appearance. And because wood is a renewable resource, families who choose hardwood caskets leave a lasting legacy for future generations.

Outer Burial Containers

An outer burial container, also known as a vault, is the container that surrounds the casket in the grave. There is no law that requires you to use a vault. However, many cemeteries ask that you use such a container so the grave does not sink. Most of the families we serve do choose to use a vault and most do select a vault that is warranted by the manufacturer to be waterproof. We offer two basic types of vaults: those constructed of metal and those constructed of concrete.



Concrete Vaults

Concrete vaults consist of two pieces: the base and the cover. The base of the vault is installed in the grave. After the service, the casket is lowered into the base and the cover is then placed on top of the base. A butyl compound seals the base and the cover, which fit together with a tongue and groove construction. An inner liner is chemically bonded to the inside of the base and the cover. Concrete burial vaults will differ in price due to the type of inner liner that is used, the weight of the vault and the presence of different metals used, such as bronze, copper and stainless steel.

The double reinforced Triune Collection consists of the Bronze Triune, the Copper Triune and the Stainless Steel Triune. These vaults are of the same extra heavy duty concrete construction used in the Wilbert Bronze. They are not lined on the outside, but are lined on the inside with the same liner as used in the Wilbert Bronze. The vault is then relined on the inside with either the bronze, copper or stainless steel as its name indicates. A carapace, made of the same metal liner as used on the inside, is on the cover as well as a name plate. The Venetian weighs some 400 lbs. less than the Triune series vaults and utilizes a less expensive liner material. It does include a carapace on the cover and a nameplate. The Continental weighs just slightly less than the Venetian and uses the least expensive type of liner. It does not include a carapace, but does include a nameplate. The Monticello weighs 500 lbs. less than the Continental and uses the same liner material. It does not include a nameplate.



Metal Vaults

Metal vaults consist of a two-piece construction, the base and the dome. The base is installed flat in the bottom of the grave. When the service is over, the casket is lowered down onto the base. The base itself is not flat; it has a raised portion which elevates the casket approximately 5 1/2 inches from the ground. The dome is then lowered into the grave and latched to the base. The dome traps a pocket of air that contains the casket. Therefore, water cannot reach the casket due to this air pocket. The dome is curved at the top, allowing for any condensation to go down the side of the vault and exit at the bottom. Before leaving the factory, all of the vaults are subjected to a number of quality control tests, which includes a submersion test into six feet of water. While metal vaults all seal in the same manner, they can be constructed from different materials: copper, stainless steel, galvanized steel and steel.

Copper vaults are the most expensive type of metal vaults. They are manufactured from 10 or 12 gauge solid copper, which never rusts. The copper vaults are finished to enhance the beauty of the copper.

Stainless steel vaults are available in two colors: gray and rose. Stainless steel is a tough, strong, corrosion-resistant material that contains iron, chromium and nickel.

Galvanized steel vaults are available in three different measures of thickness: 7, 10 and 12 gauge. The 7 gauge is the heaviest vault weighing 720 lbs. The 10 gauge vault weighs 535 lbs. and the 12 gauge, the lightest, weighs 435 lbs.

Galvanizing is a process in which the entire vault, inside and outside, is dipped into a hot molten zinc vat. The galvanizing provides long lasting protection as approximately 35 pounds of zinc is bonded to the base metal. Painted steel vaults, which are not galvanized, complete the line of metal burial vaults.

Cremation Containers

A cremation container is a container that the body is placed in for the cremation process. Cremation containers range from mahogany, to a rigid, leak resistant, combustible, corrugated box. The family may elect to have a funeral service or visitation with the body present in the container selected. A direct cremation would consist of only family identification of the body in the cremation container. The family would then be given the option of having a visitation or a memorial service without the body present. Other containers are constructed of cherry, oak, pine and canvas cloth or gray flannel covered wood. Any hardwood casket is acceptable to use as well. A cremation container constructed of wood, similar to a hardwood casket used for burial, is available as a rental container.

Urn Selection

The selection of the urn is very important since the urn provides both a protective and dignified receptacle for the cremated remains. It can become an important focal point at a memorial service and can serve as a permanent memorial to the deceased.





Deciding what will be done with the cremated remains may help decide what type of urn to select. The family may decide to bury the urn on a cemetery lot. Some cemeteries allow urns to be buried on the same space as a previously interred casket or other urn. When burial of the urn is the choice, many families opt to use a special urn vault to house and protect the urn. The urn may be permanently placed in a mausoleum or columbarium, special above ground structures designed for this purpose. Some families elect to keep the urn within the home.

Other options include scattering the cremated remains in a cemetery scattering garden, at sea, or in some other location, so long as it is in accordance with local laws. The decision to scatter should be chosen carefully in that it is irreversible. When scattering or any other form of disposition is chosen, a small portion of the cremated remains may be kept in a smaller keepsake urn created to become a focal point of memorialization in the home.



Our basic fee for the funeral director and staff includes, but is not limited to, staff to respond to initial request for service, 24 hours a day, 365 days of the year, conducting the arrangement conference, securing necessary permits, documents and authorizations, preparing notices, temporarily sheltering the deceased up to 4 days, and coordinating the arrangements with the cemetery, crematory, or third parties.
