

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

October 19, 2025 | World Mission Sunday

"Yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will see that she gets justice, so that she won't eventually come and wear me out with her coming!"

Dear Parishioners of St. Joseph,

Benjamin Franklin (1706- 1790) probably sounds very familiar with many of us. He was one of the most influential figures in American history, a person of wide-ranging knowledge and skills. He helped draft the Declaration of Independence and the U.S. Constitution as the founding father of the United States. He has been an inspiration for many people and personally for me with some of his beautiful and motivational sayings:

"An investment in knowledge pays the best interest."

"Well done is better than well said."

"Energy and persistence conquer all things."

Let us just spend some time reflecting upon these sayings today, particularly taking them and apply them to our Gospel reading of this week.

Are these sayings trying to communicate the following messages to us as follows?

- 1. Action is required for a positive change Overcoming obstacles and challenges of our life requires our active application of our hard work and energy toward a desired goal.
- 2. Failure should never be the end Persistence is what often separates those who succeed from those who do not.
- 3. Discipline builds momentum The consistent application of our hardworks is the vehicle for progress.
- 4. The impossible can become reality when we focus on concrete achievements, small successes, and realistic goals.

Look at the Gospel of this week, the judge, who neither feared God nor respected anyone, was eventually worn down by the relentless persistence of the poor widow. If her perseverance could move an unjust judge to act—not out of compassion but just to stop being bothered—how much more will God, who is loving and just, respond to our constant prayers?

God urges us to "pray always and never lose heart," because He will surely answer our prayers. He is not like the unjust judge, but a merciful and powerful Father. And we are not strangers to Him—we are His children, His chosen ones. The invitation for us to do this week is to "pray always" which means to make prayer the essence of our life, not something optional or occasional. Likewise, to pray with persistence does not mean demanding until we get what we want, but rather asking for the grace to accept God's will. True prayer transforms our desires to align with God's plan. Only when our will becomes one with God's will, what is best for us truly comes into our lives.

Now consider doing it this week: In our daily schedule, set a specific time for prayer and remain faithful to it. "Well done is better than well said."


