

Impostor priest email/texting scams

Recently, there has been an increase in reports of fraudulent email solicitations for financial support, usually in the form of gift cards. These reports are coming from email accounts or text messages identifying as Archdiocesan priests. To minimize fraudulent impact, pastors are encouraged to remind their membership that priests/churches would never make such appeals to the parish community. Advise parishioners to notify the church office immediately if they receive any unfamiliar donation requests.

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

December 14, 2025 | Third Sunday of Advent

Dear Parishioners of St. Joseph,

Another liturgical year has begun! This scriptural passage beautifully captures Advent's themes of expectation and joy, reminding us that Christ's birth illuminates our path through sin and uncertainty as it fulfills the ancient promises of the prophets. It encourages reflection on how God's light enters our lives today, preparing us for the fullness of his presence at Christmas and beyond.

I am sure you have already noticed what Advent has brought that is different from other liturgical seasons, especially the Advent wreath. The Advent wreath is a cherished symbol in Catholic popular piety, particularly in homes and parishes during the Advent season, which prepares us all for the celebration of Christ's Nativity.

The wreath consists of evergreen branches forming a circle, symbolizing eternal life and God's unending faithfulness, with four candles that are lit progressively each Sunday of Advent. This practice serves as a domestic reminder of the Church's liturgical journey, fostering prayerful anticipation of Christ's coming in history, always present in the Eucharist, and at the end of time. As Pope Benedict XVI explained, Advent reminds us that God "did not take himself away from the world" but enters our history as a humble visitor, transforming our daily struggles into opportunities for encounter. The wreath's candles are often violet, which symbolizes penance and preparation, with one rose-colored for Gaudete Sunday, which emphasizes joy.

Meanings of the Four Candles:

The Church's official documents emphasize the collective symbolism of the four candles as recalling "the various stages of salvation history prior to Christ's coming," rather than assigning rigid, individualized meanings to each one. Catholic tradition, rooted in the same salvation history, often interprets them as follows, drawing from the Sunday themes of Advent and the prophets' messages:

First Candle (Hope) - Lit on the First Sunday, it represents the hope given through the patriarchs and prophets, such as Abraham's covenant and Isaiah's visions of a coming Savior. It calls us to trust in God's faithfulness amid uncertainty.

Second Candle (Peace or Preparation) - Added on the Second Sunday, it symbolizes peace and the prophetic call to repentance, exemplified by figures like John the Baptist who prepare the way for the Lord (Is 40:3-5). It invites reflection on reconciling with God and others.

Fourth Candle (Love or Purity) - Kindled on the Fourth Sunday, it points to love manifested in the Annunciation to Mary, highlighting her fiat ("let it be done") as the culmination of salvation history's preparation. It focuses on pure-hearted waiting for Christ's birth.

The Advent wreath theologically invites us to active waiting, transforming Advent from mere anticipation into a transformative encounter with Christ's light. By lighting these candles weekly, we join the Church in professing that "the Lord is near" (Phil 4:5), preparing our hearts for the mystery of the Incarnation.
