



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

January 25, 2026 | Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear parishioners of St. Joseph,

As some of you requested the one-minute catechesis I shared during last week's Mass, I'm using this Pastor's Letter to provide it for your personal reference.

Most of us know when the offertory is during Mass because it's so obvious when we see ushers passing out the baskets of collection during Mass. While most Catholics think the Offertory is the "break" in the Mass, the offertory is one of the most mysterious and powerful exchanges between God and His people?

1. The Offertory is Biblical

From the Old Testament, God teaches His people to offer the work of their hands: Abel offered the "firstlings of his flock." Abraham offered bread and wine through Melchizedek. Israel offered gifts at the Temple as a sign of their life given back to God. So, the offertory is not a human invention, but rather it's the continuation of God's will for us.

2. The bread and wine are symbols of our entire week

The Church specifically chooses bread and wine because they represent human work. Bread does not fall from heaven. It comes from grain that is planted, harvested, ground, and baked. Wine does not appear by miracle alone. It requires pruning, crushing, fermentation, and patience. So when the priest lifts them up and says: "Blessed are You, Lord God of all creation..." He is also lifting up your work, your week, your sweat, your struggles, your victories, your hidden sacrifices, and your silent prayers. The Offertory is the moment you put your entire life on the altar, even things you never said out loud.

3. The offertory is your sacrifice united with Christ's.

At Calvary, Christ offered Himself completely to the Father. At Mass, that one sacrifice becomes present again. At Offertory, you place your own sacrifice beside His: Your pain, your marriage problems, your failures, your temptations, your job stress, your hopes for the future, your thanksgiving.

The Church teaches: "The faithful offer themselves with Christ to God." (CCC 1368) This is why the priest says: "Pray, brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable..."

This is why we should never come to mass empty-handed; not just money, which is needed for our church. But more importantly, a heart ready to be offered is crucial.

Many Catholic faithful wonder where the collections or offerings given during the Holy Mass actually go. The collection taken during Mass is used to support the mission of the Church, especially:

- The needs of the local parish (worship, utilities, maintenance, parish staff)
- The support of the clergy (stipends)
- Works of charity and assistance to the poor
- The diocesan and universal mission of the Church (when a second or special collection is designated)

Catechism of the Catholic Church

- "The faithful also have the duty of providing for the material needs of the Church, each according to his abilities."
- CCC 2043

Code of Canon Law

- "The Christian faithful are obliged to assist with the needs of the Church so that the Church has what is necessary for divine worship, for works of the apostolate and of charity, and for the decent support of ministers."
- Canon 222 §1


