





FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

July 27, 2025 | 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Mary has chosen the better part, and it will not be taken from her." (Luke 10:42)

Dear parishioners of St. Joseph,

Last week, on the 16th Sunday in Ordinary Time, I shared a reflection with you on prayer and action through the example of Mary and Martha as they welcomed Jesus into their home. I would like to include my homily in this week's bulletin for us to continue contemplating this message.

When reading this Gospel passage, we often contrast Mary and Martha. Depending on our personal inclinations, those of us who love prayer would understand Mary better, while those who prefer action relate to Martha. But that is not what Jesus wants to teach us today from this Gospel. Jesus neither favors Mary nor criticizes Martha. In fact, Jesus frequently calls us to action and not just lip service: "Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 7:21).

However, if we look more closely to the Gospel passage, we will notice that Martha receives a gentle correction from Jesus because she was "anxious and worried about many things," not because she was actively serving, but she was agitated seeing Mary, his sister, simply sitting near to Jesus and listening while she herself was going all the serving. Both prayer and action are necessary and must be in harmony with each other. Without prayer, our work becomes restless noise. Without being nourished by prayer, everything we do turns mechanical, dry, and soulless.

The message for each one of us is To Be Both: Martha and Mary

There was a parish priest in the countryside whose housekeeper was named Martha. Every time she heard this Gospel, she would grumble, "Of course, Mary is right and Martha is wrong. But who swept the floors, cooked the food, and washed the dishes? Who went to the market, did the laundry, cleaned the kitchen? If I didn't do those things, who would? If I just sat, thought, talked about spiritual things, and went to pray alone in church, wouldn't everyone be starving at mealtime?" Isn't this thought of "that Martha" the same as many of us? How can we explain this Gospel to people like her?

Both Martha and Mary are symbols of two ways of life: While Martha symbolizes active life, Mary symbolizes contemplative life. Love to God loses its mystery in active life if teaching and guidance don't lead to contemplation. These two sisters represent two attitudes that a complete disciple, like us, cannot separate. But action must always be directed toward contemplation and prayer. St. Augustine explains with a metaphor: Martha and Mary welcomed Jesus into their home, which represents the Church. Martha symbolizes the Church Militant; Mary, the Church Triumphant. Serving is good. Sitting at the feet of Jesus and listening to Him is even better. But the message is not to choose one and reject the other—it's to choose both: service and prayer, with prayer taking the lead, the better part for the disciples of Christ.

We all can agree on this fact: real life is busy. Some of us don't always have time to sit at Jesus' feet for long for many different reasons. So, how about letting Jesus sit in your mind for all day activities? If we can't sit long at His feet, let Him dwell long in our thoughts. Is it an ideal way for our prayer life, it is not; but at least, it is the beginning of improving our spiritual life. How?

- Repeat short prayers throughout the day:
- "Our Father," "Lord, have mercy on me," "Jesus, I trust in You"
- · Start each morning by offering your whole day to God The Morning Offering Prayer or attending daily mass at the start of the day as you let the first intention of the day direct everything else that we do. A good leader doesn't do everything but directs everything else to God.
- During the day, let songs or images remind you of God: a crucifix around you, a rosary that you see at work, a Christian song that you listen to; even making the Sign of the Cross before meals can help.

Let Jesus Sit in Your Mind - St. Paul said: "Whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God." Someone has asked, "how can we evaluate our prayer life, whether it's good or needs improvement?" I would say this, the best way to evaluate our spiritual life is to ask ourselves, "what is the very first thing I do every morning?" Do I pick up the phone as soon as I walk up? Or do I do the sign of the cross and begin praying and offering my whole day to God?" And if we are honest with ourselves, we know right away where our heart is, whether we direct our heart and intention to God or to the things of God.


