Timeline: From Exile to Return & Restoration

Zerubbabel, Ezra, and Nehemiah

The Exile Begins (605–586 BC)

 605 BC – First deportation to Babylon (Daniel taken) 597 BC – Second deportation (Ezekiel among 10,000)

 586 BC – Final destruction of Jerusalem & the Temple

 70 years of exile prophesied by Jeremiah begins

First Return – Zerubbabel's Group (538–515 BC)

• 538 BC – Cyrus the Great issues decree (Ezra 1)

• Leaders: Zerubbabel (governor), Jeshua (high priest)

 Focus: Rebuilding the altar & Temple foundation (Ezra 3)

> 515 BC – Temple completed under Darius

Second Return – Ezra's Group (458 BC)

Leader: Ezra,priest & scribe

Purpose: Teach the Law of God (Ezra 7)

• Emphasis:
Holiness, covenant
faithfulness, true
worship

Third Return – Nehemiah's Group (445 BC)

- Leader: Nehemiah, cupbearer to Persian king
- Purpose: Rebuild Jerusalem's walls (Nehemiah 1–6)
- Walls rebuilt in 52 days despite opposition
- Nehemiah & Ezra lead great assembly, Law is read (Nehemiah 8)
