REFLECTION

By Fr. Rich Jasper - May 3, 2026
Fifth Sunday of Easter

Day By Day...

Most of us, I believe, still have the Baltimore Catechism definition of 'sacrament' stored somewhere in our memory: "A sacrament is an outward sign instituted by Christ to give grace."

I am happy to report that there is (and will be) a lot of grace spilling all over the place here at Immaculate Conception parish this weekend and in the weeks to come. This Sunday, many of our 8-and-9-year-old parishioners will be receiving Christ for the first time in the Sacrament of Holy Communion, and then later in June, our high school-aged students will be receiving the gift of the Holy Spirit in Confirmation. It really is an exciting time in the spiritual lives of these young people, even if they don't yet completely understand the fullness of the Gift they are receiving.

As it was for me when I was younger, so it is for so many of our First Communicants this weekend: the day is often remembered for the outfit, the party and the presents. But even these things speak to the fact that something vitally important has happened in their young lives, and that the invitation to follow the Lord more closely has been extended. Ultimately, that is why the understanding of 'sacrament' is important – it is God's way of showing us that He remains with us at every moment of our lives, feeding us and strengthening us to follow the Gospel and live more authentically in true relationship with the Trinity and with one another.

May our First Communicants and those who will soon be confirmed live the prayer of St. Richard of Chichester, and may we offer this prayer on their behalf, especially this weekend: "Thanks be to You, O Lord, for all the graces and benefits You have given to us. May I know Thee more clearly, love Thee more dearly, and follow Thee more nearly day by day." (And you thought that this was only a song from *Godspell* ... we Catholics had it long before Broadway and Hollywood!)

May today's First Communion be the beautiful start of a lifetime of receiving our Lord and loving Him in the Eucharist and the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Amen.

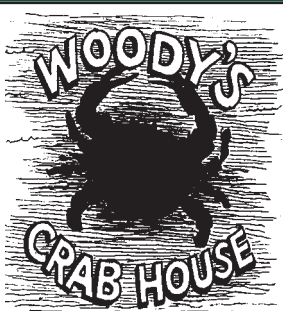

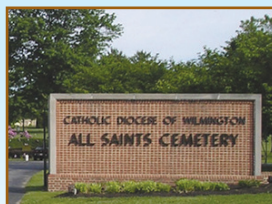
