REFLECTION

Sixth Sunday of Easter

Oh, Mary We Crown Thee...

One of the Catholic school memories I most cherish revolves around the annual May Procession that our parish held during the week leading up to Mother's Day. Even as a moody middle-school student, I didn't really mind dressing-up in my uniform and returning to school in the evening in order to process around the perimeter of the Church while praying the Rosary and singing Marian hymns. The parade of flowers and candles, the younger children adorned in First Communion dresses and suits, and the gaggle of parents standing curbside in order to take photos of the procession (long before cellphones) said to us that something important – something holy – was happening here.

All of us knew that this moment was more than just crowning a statue. The May Procession reminded us that the Blessed Mother is God's gift to us and to the world. She who said yes to the Lord's will throughout her life taught us to do the same, and in honoring her motherhood, we are honoring her Son, our Savior. After all, her Heart always pointed the way to Christ, from Bethlehem and Cana to Calvary and the Upper Room at Pentecost.

As we celebrate Mother's Day this weekend, may we take some time to thank our Lord not only for Mary's role in our lives, but also for our own Moms. Oftentimes it has been they who were the first teachers of the faith, and it was they who – like Our Lady – pointed the way back to God if and when we went astray. They have prayed for us, sacrificed for us, and loved us unconditionally. As one poet once said: "How can we deny the existence of a loving, merciful God when all around us the world is uplifted by the tender love of our mothers?"

This past Sunday, as our own parish's young people made their First Communion and presented flowers to our Lady during Mass, I prayed that they would always experience a love of Mary in their own lives. May they know that they can always count on her to hear their prayers and guide them on life's journey. After all – just as our own moms and grandmothers would – our Lady never stops reaching out to us, loving us unconditionally.

Happy Mother's Day to all those special women who show us the way to God's Heart by giving us their own.

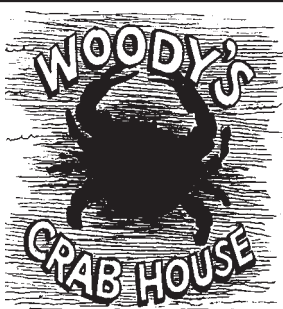

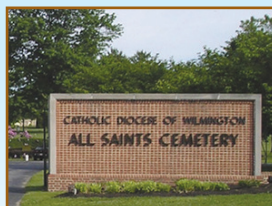

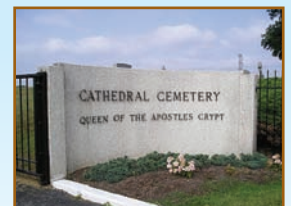
