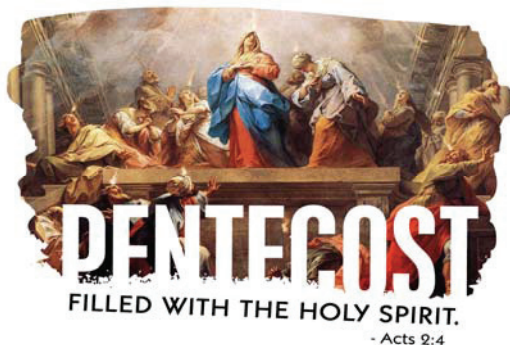

REFLECTION

Remembering Deacon Mike ...

How blessed we have been as a parish for more than 15 years to have Deacon Mike walk with us as a servant of Christ and brother to each of us. Through it all -- the challenges and the joys of being Church -- Mike was by our side, offering his wisdom, spiritual direction and love in a way that was unique and true to his style.

From time to time, that style came with a "bark" or a wry side-comment, but even these moments were ways in which he showed us how much he cared about us, and how much his faith and vocation meant to him. He loved his wife Bobbie fiercely and showed us all what a devoted marriage looks like, especially in times of the cross. He was forever sharing stories of Andrea, Murat and his grandsons, and how much he loved them. Cincinnati always found a way into conversations, too. It was almost like another member of the Truman family!

What touched me most profoundly about Mike, however, was how important the spiritual and liturgical life of the Church was to him. You didn't mess around with the Mass, and prayer was a sacred encounter with the Divine. Deacon Mike was a true servant leader, and he gave of himself in countless -- and often hidden -- ways, from visiting shut-ins and the incarcerated to training our liturgical ministers and taking on the role of teacher. He and Deacon Ben have poured out their lives for the people of Immaculate Conception and St. Jude. We are better and holier because of our deacons.

One of the last books Mike gave me as a gift -- he loved his books -- was a set of sermons written over the years by the late Cardinal Joseph Bernardin of Chicago. Bernardin, as you may remember, had a very public battle with cancer and used his final days to speak about returning to the Lord. He once wrote: "What I would like to leave behind is a simple prayer that each of you may find what I have found -- God's special gift to us all: the gift of His peace. When we are at peace, we find the freedom to be fully ourselves, even in the worst of times. We let go of what is non-essential. We empty ourselves so that God may more fully work within us, and we become instruments in the hands of the Lord."

Deacon Mike did just that -- became an instrument in the hands of His Savior. On behalf of this Elkton and North East parish community that loved him so, I simply echo Jesus' words to the one who used his talents wisely: "Well done, good and faithful servant."

As we celebrate Pentecost Sunday and the birthday of the Church this weekend, may we all strive to live the call of Jesus to be humble and loving servants to one another in His Name, and may we continue to pray daily that our Lord will provide His Church with a new springtime of holy vocations to the priesthood, religious life and diaconate. No doubt, Deacon Mike will be interceding on our behalf!

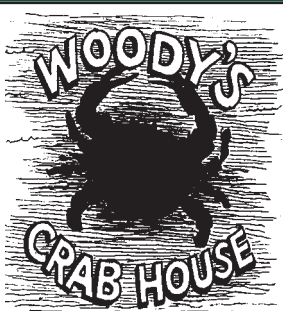

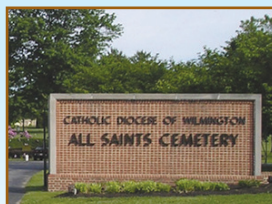
