REFLECTION

The Most Holy Trinity

Love is "Cheep"...

A few weeks back, I was asked to bless the newly-hatched chicks that students in one of our diocesan elementary schools were raising as a part of a program sponsored by the University of Delaware College of Agriculture. Believe it or not, our Church has a blessing for almost everything – from cars and ships to office spaces and farm animals – so I was more than happy to oblige in the request.

To see the joy and wonder on the kindergartners' faces as they explained to me how they watched the eggs crack open and new life spill forth is something I won't soon forget. They couldn't wait to explain how they first held them, fed and cared for them, and even named them. (You can imagine some of those names!). "We're helping the chicks grow by how we care for them," said one student as he jumped up-and-down with such excited innocence.

Growing together and caring for one another. the challenge for all of us this Trinity Sunday. At the heart of this feast is the understanding that the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit are in intimate relation with one another, each distinct and yet One. Ultimately, the Divine Love shared in the Trinity is offered to us who are made in God's image and likeness, and it is our task to share that Love with others and with all of God's creation.

As Franciscan Father Greg Friedman describes it, "The Trinity is intimacy hidden in mystery," and it is ours to embrace and share with the world. No doubt the students who had me bless their tiny creatures caught a glimpse of the mystery and beauty of God these last few weeks – and have come to understand their role in caring for creation – all thanks to a few baby chicks from the University of Delaware.

This Rocks: As you drive out of Immaculate Conception church parking lot this weekend, pay attention to the stones that the Knights of Columbus have placed as a border around the recently-planted crepe myrtle trees near the statue of Our Lady. Many years ago, someone thought to save some of the original stone from our first church on Bridge Street as the structure was being demolished. Gratefully, these stones have recently been returned to us, and now are once again a part of our beloved parish property. What a beautiful connection between where we began and where we now continue to grow!
