REFLECTION

The Heart of It All ...

This coming Thursday and Friday, June 11 and 12, the Diocese of Wilmington is privileged to welcome our Eucharistic Lord in public procession and times of Adoration as we celebrate both our nation's 250th anniversary of independence as well as the dedication of our country to the Sacred Heart of Jesus by our Catholic bishops. How fortunate we are as American citizens to have the freedom and right to worship as we wish, and how blessed we have been by God for the many ways He holds and protects us in His Merciful Heart.

In Pope Francis' encyclical letter *Dilexit Nos*, written shortly before his passing, our Holy Father states that the human and divine love of the Heart of Jesus is the one true remedy for all the ills that plague society and the human heart. "In His Sacred Heart, Christ moves us to return love for love," wrote the Pope, who later in his encyclical quoted Pope Saint John Paul II: "Our acts of love, service and reconciliation [toward our sisters and brothers] are what build a civilization of love empowered by Christ." In His Heart, then, we find healing; we find the way forward. His Sacred Heart should make us want to give our lives for others.

While I was growing-up (as I am sure it was for many of you), it was common to see Catholic homes have a picture of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary framed and hung prominently for all to see. Very often – as it was in my grandparents' house – a small American flag was placed behind the image of the Sacred Heart, thus reminding all who passed by that it is Heart that holds us, and we should remember often to pray for our nation and to entrust her care to Our Lord and His Mother. Wouldn't it be incredible if we brought this Sacred-and-Immaculate Heart devotion back to our homes?

As we celebrate Corpus Christi Sunday (the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ) this weekend, may we entrust our parish, our families, our nation and our diocese to the Lord's Sacred Heart. May we continually seek true healing and communion through our love and reverence for His Presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament. As St. Margaret Mary Alacoque once wrote: "Because Jesus loves you infinitely, unlimited is the joy you bring to His Sacred Heart when you spend time with Him in the Blessed Sacrament."
