REFLECTION

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Cross-Country...

One of the things I love most about priesthood is the opportunity to meet so many people at different points along their respective journeys of faith.

Just the other day, I met a young man who has recently returned from a bicycle trek across the country, from Delmarva to the Deep South, across the Gulf States into Texas and the Southwest, and then finally up the Pacific Coast Highway. I couldn't even make it from North East to Elkton on a bike, so his determination and sense of adventure inspires me (not to take-up cycling, mind you – but it is inspiring, nevertheless!)

While listening to the tales of his excursion, I found myself asking him where he found “God moments” along the way. Nature, he said, certainly opened his heart to the reality of the One who could create such majestic beauty in our land. Surprisingly, he also came to see that the hours of silence on the miles of deserted highway also made it possible to go deeper within himself and experience a God-given peace that is rare to find in a very noisy world. (“Whatever you do,” he offered, “work more times of silence into your daily life.”)

Mostly, though, this young cyclist said he found God's presence in other people, those “random strangers” who cared for his safety and well-being; who offered water and an air-conditioned office trailer to rest; the man just outside Tallahassee who repaired a flat tire for free; the Dallas woman who suggested he take a safer route through north Texas to New Mexico. Each in his or her own way showed the face of Christ to another pilgrim on the journey and fed him in countless ways.

In this Sunday's Gospel, Christ multiplies the loaves and then asks the disciples to take what He's done and share it with the hungry crowd. There are so many souls around us seeking to be fed in a number of ways. How will you and I become ones who feed and care for another person in the days ahead? No doubt, there are countless opportunities.

After fleeing from the revenge of the King of Israel, Elijah hid in a cave, but at the command of God, he went outside and stood on a mountain. There the Lord came to him, not in the wind nor in the earthquake, but in a "tiny whispering sound."

Second Reading: Romans 9:1-5

Paul is deeply pained because the Jews - in spite of everything that has been given to them - have rejected Christ.

Gospel: Matthew 14:22-33

Matthew vividly recounts the event of Jesus walking on the water. When the disciples see this, they are terrified, and Jesus chastises them for their fear. Peter begs Christ to let him walk on the water; he is at first brave but begins to sink and loses faith, crying out, "Lord save me!" Christ rescues him for his faltering faith.

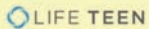

The Ronald McDonald House will recycle the can tabs. In 2025, the children received \$5334.00 from the funds of recycled tabs. The funds are utilized for snacks, transportation to the hospital, and laundry facilities.
