REFLECTION

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Lessons from a Broken Shell...

The godparents had flown in from the West Coast to celebrate the Baptism of their sister's little girl, now three months old. Not only was it a sacred moment, but it was also a special time for family to be together again when they are usually separated by thousands of miles.

As I was preparing the font after Mass in order to celebrate the sacrament, the godfather approached me holding a beautiful ceramic shell that had the baby's name and baptism date engraved upon it. "Father, could you use this to pour the water as you baptize her?" he asked.

"I'd be honored to," I replied, as he handed the shell to me. And then, in the blink of an eye, we both watched it dramatically slip from my hand to the marble floor below. (Cue the dramatic music ...)

Thankfully, all was not lost. Much of the shell remained intact, although a pretty decent chip came off the bottom. I felt terrible, of course, even though everyone was telling me not to worry. "It happens; no worries." You know: all the things folks say to you when you mess-up royally.

In the moment, though, this struck me as I picked-up the broken pieces from the floor: our lives are often very messy. Like the ceramic shell, we break from time-to-time. And although we try to keep that glossy outer appearance from cracking, it happens to all of us. Sometimes our sins or the sins of others cause the breaking to happen.

And yet, into the mess, Christ comes. He takes our broken pieces and heals us through His Cross. He loves us in our imperfections and tells us to come to Him to find everything our hearts are searching for. Baptism is that sacred way in which our Lord makes us whole again in Him, and it becomes the open door to a beautiful, loving relationship with Him and His Church.

I mentioned something to that effect as I used the broken shell at the font that Sunday afternoon. To which the godfather jokingly said after the ceremony, "Father, you didn't have to break it in order to come up with that sermon!"
