School Days

I'm told that I used to cling to trees on the way to the bus stop in the beginning days of kindergarten, such was my hatred of school. Some days, my fears were so bad, I was pushing through the line of children boarding the bus in order to disembark and run back home. Thankfully, that practice ended by sophomore year (haha!).

So yes, I feel for the anxious and nervously-excited children (and teachers) who are returning to school this time of year, and for the parents who will miss the more relaxed schedule of summer vacation. At the same time, however, it is clear just how important a quality education is in order to form young people who embrace both faith and responsible citizenship as they make their way in the world.

A teacher-friend of mine recently passed along a prayer challenge that he gives to his students at the start of the academic year. It is worthy of reflection whether or not we are heading back to school:

Promise yourself ...

*To be strong that nothing can disturb your peace of mind.
To make all your friends feel that there is something special about them.*

To be optimistic in every undertaking you tackle.

To be just as enthusiastic about the success of others as you are about your own.

To think only of the best and to work for the best.

To forgive yourself for the mistakes of the past and to press on to greater achievements in the future.

To smile often.

To criticize others less.

To be too large for worry, too noble for anger, too strong for fear, and too peaceful to permit the presence of trouble.

And I would add one final thought: *To stay on the bus until you get to school.*

To all our students and teacher-parishioners: Have a blessed school year ahead! Be assured of our support and prayers.

Paul tells the Christians to make sacrifices to avoid the trappings of the times, and to do God's will.

Gospel: Matthew 16:21-27

Jesus tries to make his disciples realize that by following him, they will endure suffering, degradation, and death. He tells them that they must deny themselves and take up the cross in order to be his disciples.

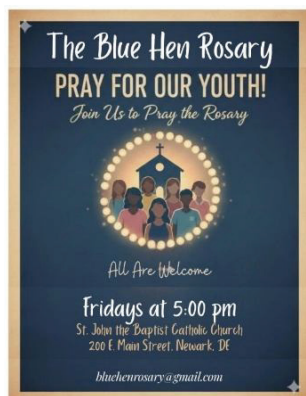
Mount Aviat's Annual Roast Beef Dinner
