REFLECTION

Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

It's the Little Things ...

While traveling to All Saints Cemetery after celebrating a recent funeral Mass, I witnessed something so rarely seen that it touched me profoundly: an older gentleman waiting for a bus took off his hat and blessed himself as the hearse and procession passed by. It was such a humble sign of respect for a stranger that I remember asking the funeral director who was driving us: "Do you see much of that these days?" His response was telling: "I see more road rage than anything else. Impatient drivers are always trying to outrace us."

I once believed that witnessing to our Catholic faith always had to come in big ways in order for it to have any lasting effect: martyrdom; preaching the Gospel publicly; establishing new parishes and schools. Certainly, these are all good and holy things.

More and more, however, I think it is those tiny moments which go mostly unseen by others that God uses to establish His Kingdom here on Earth: the family that prays a Rosary together in their living room for a dying neighbor or relative; offering a 'Hail Mary' whenever one passes a fire truck or rescue vehicle; blessing oneself before meals or when passing a Catholic Church. All of these little seemingly-insignificant faith moments remind us that each person is worthy of love and respect, and that every moment of life can be – and is, in truth – infused with God's grace.

A poster I once saw hanging in a classroom read: "The little things? The little moments? They're not little to God." It took a respectful gentleman waiting for a bus to remind me of this very fact.

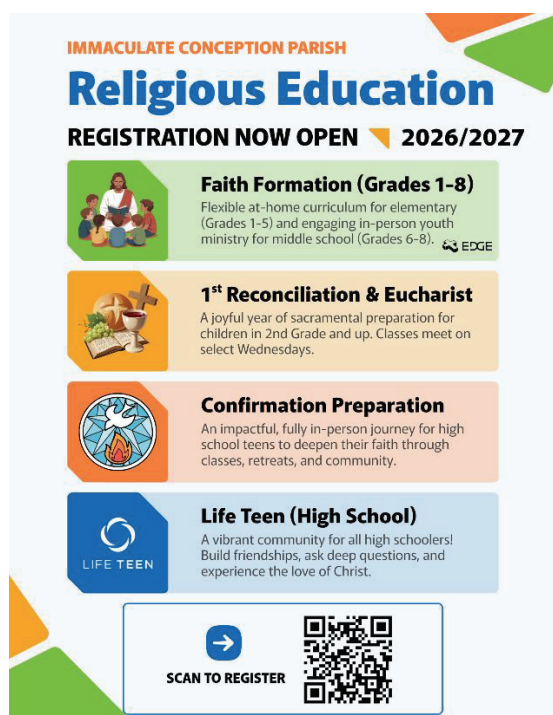

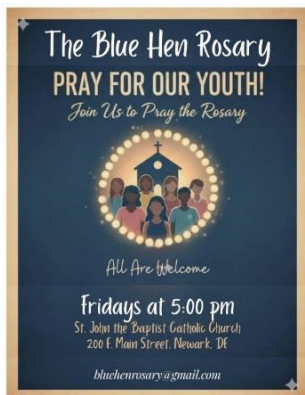
AROUND THE COMMUNITY
