REFLECTION

Working It Out

In my first-ever job as a 14-year-old, I worked briefly for a summer – a trying 8 weeks – as a busboy at a diner we locals called “The Blue Vomit” (although the neon sign outside flashed its true identity: The Blue Comet). That nickname says all you need to know about that experience.

As a high school sophomore, however, I was hired to work as a cashier and stock-boy for a mom-and-pop pharmacy that valiantly tried for many years to give Walgreens and CVS a run for their money. By the time I left that job upon graduation from college, I not only had become a pharmacy-tech but had also grown to love the people I had worked with during those many years. We had become like a family, and the pharmacist-owner was a second father to me. I was blessed to have learned so much from my years working at that corner store, especially when it came to caring for others who were ill and in pain.

I know that it is common for most of us to complain about work; it even will sometimes bond us with co-workers and friends. “I live for the weekends,” many of us say, and we constantly count the days until our next vacation. None of this is necessarily bad, of course.

And yet, as we pause this weekend to celebrate Labor Day, may we never forget the sacred value our Lord and his Church has placed on the dignity of work and, most especially, the worker. After all, God Himself “spent most of his life working with his hands, dedicated to this task in a simple life in Nazareth” (Pope Francis). As our *Catechism* states in paragraph 2427: “Work honors the Creator’s gifts and the talents received from Him. Work is for the human person, not the human person for work.”

Let us pray in a special way this weekend for all who are struggling to find employment, and for an increase in respect for all who work difficult and often overlooked jobs. May we also give thanks to God for the opportunities we have had along the way to make a good living, provide for our families, and form friendships that have lasted beyond the workplace.

And who knows? Perhaps one day I will even be able to thank our Lord for the summer I spent busing tables at the Blue Vomit.

Readings for Next Week: Twenty-Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Times

First Reading: Sirach 27:30—28:7

Sirach advises all to forgive the faults of their neighbor. Only by forgiving the sins of others, can a person expect to be forgiven his sins.

Second Reading: Romans 14:7-9

Paul stresses that no one is his own master; we are responsible to the Lord, and we belong to him in both life and death.

Gospel: Matthew 18:21-35

This narrative points out the difference between mercy and justice. When Peter asks how often he should forgive someone who wrongs him, Jesus answers, "...not seven times: I say seventy times seven times." Jesus then narrates the story of the king who was merciful to his official by forgiving him all his debts, but this same official showed no mercy to his own servant.
