If you are looking for a good laugh as we begin this New Year, seek out a recent video that has gone viral in which a Florida woman spreads a little cheer at a Wawa somewhere in the Sunshine State.

It would seem that this Mom, filled with the joy of the Christmas season, was so moved by the kindness of a stranger who was washing her car's windshield that she went up to him, embraced him, and told him just how much she loves humanity, especially at this time of year. "People doing little acts of kindness make the world a better place ... thank YOU!" she cried-out to this kind window-washer.

There was just one problem, however: it wasn't her car he was cleaning. He was, in fact, washing his own windshield. And he was just hugged by some strange lady chirping about keeping Christmas joy all year long.

Needless to say, she was mortified when she realized her error; he was dumbfounded by what was happening. First Reading: Isaiah 49:3, 5-6


