## REFLECTION

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

### Taught by a Saint...

My high school theology teacher, Fr. Bill Atkinson, O.S.A., recently had his cause opened for canonization. I must admit that it is both humbling and exciting to be able to say that I was taught by a future saint of the Catholic Church.

Fr. Atkinson became a quadriplegic as a result of a sledding accident during his time in the Augustinian novitiate back in the 1960s, and was the first priest in the world granted permission to be ordained despite the severity of his injury.

Often in the classroom, he would share with us the following quotation that has been attributed to a Confederate soldier who composed this verse toward the end of the Civil War. It meant a lot to Fr. Bill; perhaps you will find inspiration in it as well:

*I asked God for strength that I might achieve; I was made weak that I might learn humbly to obey.  
I asked for health that I might do greater things; I was given infirmity that I might do better things.  
I asked for riches that I might be happy; I was given poverty that I might be wise.  
I asked for power that I might receive praise; I was given weakness that I might feel the need for God.  
I asked for all things that I might enjoy life; I was given life that I might enjoy all things.  
I got nothing that I asked for but everything I hoped for.  
Almost despite myself, my unspoken prayers were answered.  
I am among all people most richly blessed.*

During this week that we celebrate the gift of Catholic education throughout the United States, may we take the time to pray for our teachers, both past and present, who have kept the light of Christ burning within the hearts and minds of our young people. Servant of God Fr. Bill, pray for us.


