#### REFLECTION

By Fr. Rich Jasper Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time October 12, 2025

#### Mission Not Impossible ...

This weekend, Immaculate Conception parish warmly welcomes Rev. Deogratias (Deo) Ekisa to speak with us about his home Archdiocese of Tororo in Uganda. According to the information that was sent to us ahead of time, Fr. Deo's diocese is roughly the size of the entire state of New Jersey. While there are only 47 parishes total, there are 984 mission churches serving the needs of the Catholic population there. (And I thought 1 mission church kept ministry interesting!).

As you are undoubtedly aware, the Church throughout the world is in need of support in a variety of ways. In Tororo, transportation of priests to their mission posts, the education of seminarians, economic development in the diocese and water/health care are important needs that the local Church there must address. Although the parishioners in that region of Uganda certainly contribute what they can (families make about \$1000 a year), the diocese relies on assistance from their brothers and sisters here in the U.S. Church to support them in their efforts to grow the faith.

We have been very blessed here in our parish, and while we, too, are feeling the local effects of clergy shortages, I also know that Immaculate Conception and St. Jude's parishioners will do what they have always done in times past: help in whatever way they feel God is asking them to contribute to the needs of the mission Church in Uganda. Most especially, please pray for their seminarians, religious sisters, lay leaders and priests who are working tirelessly to proclaim the Gospel with limited resources.

If you are not prepared to contribute to the second collection this weekend, please send your contributions to the parish center (or drop them in the collection basket) by month's end. Pope Saint Paul VI would often say: "Some give by going to the missions; others go by giving to them."

As always, I am grateful for your generosity every time a need arises ... and even when it doesn't. I am one blessed pastor.

#### Readings for Next Week: Twenty-Nineth Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### First Reading: Exodus 17:8-13

Amalek and his people attacked the Israelites, so Moses instructed Joshua to lead some of the Israelites into battle the next day. While Moses kept his hands raised in prayer, the Israelites were winning. But when he put his hands down, they would begin to lose. So two others helped him keep his hands raised, and Joshua and the Israelites won the battle.

#### Second Reading: 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2

Paul tells Timothy that the Scriptures are inspired by God and are an excellent tool in teaching others about God's expectations of his people. Knowledge of the Scriptures, coupled with faith in Jesus, will lead many people to salvation. Paul urges Timothy to continue preaching the gospel, although this will sometimes be a difficult task.

#### Gospel: Luke 18:1-8

Jesus speaks about a corrupt judge who lacked respect for either God or man. A widow repeatedly asked him to settle a case in her favor. He finally settled the case, only because he grew weary of listening to her requests. Jesus points out that if even this corrupt judge eventually listened, then God, who is just, will certainly answer the pleas of his people.


