What Holds Us Together ...

I recently had the blessing of visiting a woman who had just entered hospice care. When I arrived, she was surrounded by her adult children who were eager to share with me how much their Mom's love meant to them for so many years. "She prayed her Rosary every day for us and for her grandchildren," one of the daughters told me. "Mom always said that love and the Rosary are what held us together as a family."

For centuries, Catholics have often found solace and strength in turning to this special devotion as a means of lifting up hearts and intentions, calming fears and asking for heavenly intercession from the Mother of God. A friend of mine once told me: "I'll be honest, I don't always pray it like I should, but I keep it with me in my pocket at all times. It reminds me that I am not alone on this journey."

During the Marian month of October, the Church reminds us that the Rosary is a beautiful, Scripturally-based prayer, and Pope Leo has recently asked us to pray it for both healing and holiness in our Church and our world. Please consider joining us every Saturday morning after the 8:30 am Mass in the chapel, or on Friday evenings at 5:00 pm with the Blue Hen Rosary, as we come together as a parish community to lift up our special intentions to our Lord through the heart of His Mother.

After all, as one wise Cecil County woman taught me just the other day: love and the Rosary will always hold us together as a family.

Next weekend, October 11 and 12, Fr. Deo will be visiting with us from the African Diocese of Tororo to speak about the important missionary work that is happening in his diocese. Paul reminds Timothy that Christ rose from the dead so that many people could be saved. Paul was being treated as a criminal and kept in chains but says, "There is no chaining the word of God!" Paul also says, "if we die in Christ, we will live in him. But if we deny him, he will deny us."

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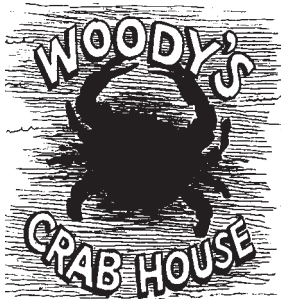


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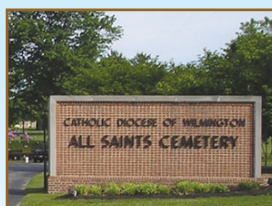
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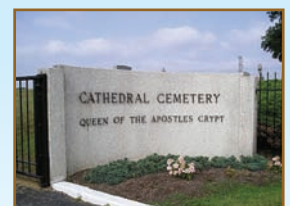
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
