REFLECTION

Thirty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

November 16, 2025

Listen, My Children ...

During my first year of teaching, I found myself doing all I could to simply keep my head above water and stay a day or two ahead of the students. Many days were successful, thank the Lord, otherwise there may not have been a year number two.

In that second year, I came-up with a plan that I thought would engage the middle-schoolers, impress the principal and 'wow' the parents: they would memorize the entire Henry Wadsworth Longfellow poem "Paul Revere's Ride." Each month we would take a stanza and commit it to memory so that by the end of the school year, the class could stand at assembly and boldly proclaim: "Listen my children, and you shall hear of the midnight ride of Paul Revere ..."

In the beginning months, the kids were fantastic, excitedly shouting "one if by land, two if by sea ..." The dying art of memorization was making a comeback in my seventh grade classroom! But right around Thanksgiving, the kids were getting careless; they stopped worrying about bell towers, horses and the Old North Church. Stanza orders became jumbled, lines forgotten, and what was intended to be fun became nothing but a boring chore.

So, a new plan: After Christmas break, I told the ones who wanted that they could continue to memorize the poem for a reward at the end of the school year, which two students received with great pride. As for the others, I wasn't letting them off the hook entirely, so the following little gem composed by Aaron Byler was offered in place of Paul Revere. Interestingly, it came back to me this past week as the news cycle seems to weigh heavier with each passing day, and the Scripture readings for this weekend discuss wars, famines and coming persecutions. It speaks volumes:

If you were busy being kind, before you knew it you would find – you'd soon forget to think 'twas true that someone was unkind to you.

If you were busy being good and doing just the best you could – you'd not have time to blame a man who's doing just the best he can.

If you were busy being true to what you know you ought to do – you'd be so able to forget the blunders of the folks you've met.

Certainly, some wise advice to live our lives and embrace our faith with integrity in these most interesting times. It may not have the same punch or length of "Paul Revere's Ride," but its message is similar: Never hide the gifts you've been given, and have the courage to jump into action whenever charity demands it. Thankfully, one need not have a horse, lantern or angry Redcoats chasing after them to live-out this message daily.

Readings for Next Week: Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

First Reading: Malachi 3:19-20a

The prophet Malachi warned that the time would come when all the evil people would be punished. He then speaks of the arrival of "the sun of justice, with its healing rays," believed by most to mean Jesus.

Second Reading: 2 Thessalonians 3:7-12

Some of the Thessalonians claimed Christ's return was imminent, so they stopped working and asked others for food. Paul describes his willingness to work, so that he would not impose on others. He encourages them to follow his example and earn their own living.

Gospel: Luke 21:5-19

Jesus warns of the persecution all Christians will face because of him, and how some will even be put to death. Yet he says they will not be harmed because "by patient endurance you will save your lives." If Jesus' followers are loyal, they will be resurrected, and their suffering will end.
