#### **REFLECTION**

By Fr. Rich Jasper – November 2, 2025 All Souls Day

#### The Gift of a Parish Family ...

As many of you have heard by now, my car was recently vandalized in the driveway of the rectory: windows were smashed and locks destroyed, and the ignition mechanism was ripped out from the steering column. Needless to say, I felt nearly every range of emotion in those pre-dawn hours when I first stumbled upon the scene of the crime, and my head was spinning with all that needed to be done: police and insurance reports; getting coverage for Baptisms and Masses I had elsewhere that day; and finding another vehicle to get me where I needed to be in the weeks to come.

And this is where you all come in. Shortly after daily Mass was finished, parishioners came over to the rectory driveway, waiting with me (and supporting me) as I waited for Elkton police to arrive. One parishioner offered to assist me with the complicated insurance process; another started making calls to fellow parishioners to see if they had cars to lend. By the end of Oktoberfest that weekend, I had no less than 30 borrowed-car offers (no exaggeration), and kind souls took the time to weather-proof my damaged windows until the tow company came on Monday.

Although it was a cross I didn't necessarily want to carry (and I told God so), there has been one beautiful blessing that has come from this entire ordeal. It is this: you really love your priests and deacons. As seminarians, we are taught that our parishioners need us as ministers and are grateful for the ways in which we bring the sacraments and help form community, and this is certainly true. But it hit home the other day – not just with the damaged car but in the support you've given since my being temporarily assigned to Good Shepherd and my Dad's recent passing that you love us, support us, storm heaven for us, and constantly lift us up when life gets difficult. You have helped me realize in a special way why priests are called "Father." and I am humbled and honored to do my best to live that relationship with you here at Immaculate Conception and St. Jude. You make us better priests, deacons and men of God, and we are blessed to have your love in our lives.

One final fun fact since this attempted theft took place. I have been using my Dad's pick-up truck as my means of transportation while my car situation remains in insurance-limbo. As a result, many jokes have come my way lately, informing me that I now really fit into Cecil County with what I drive. But quite a few parishioners have also kindly offered this thought, too: even from beyond, my Dad was still taking care of me. That brings me great comfort.

This All Souls weekend, may we take a moment to thank God for the gift of family and friends who have gone before us and now intercede for us on our own journeys. They still find ways to let us know we are loved and cared for.

Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let Your perpetual Light shine upon them. May their souls, and all the souls of the faithful departed, through Your Mercy, rest in peace. Amen.

#### First Reading: Ezekiel 47:1-2, 8-9, 12

This reading from the Prophet Ezekiel tells of the streaming, healing waters that flow from the temple. These waters restore life to the river's inhabitants as well as the fruit bearing trees along its banks. It is believed that the water signifies blessings, whereas the lack of signifies trouble and hardship.

#### Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 3:9c-11, 16-17

Paul compares us to a building whose foundation has been laid by Jesus. As the people of God, we can only be solid if we are grounded in Christ.

#### Gospel: John 2:13-22

Near the time of Passover, Jesus went up to Jerusalem and saw the temple had become a marketplace. He became angry and proceeded to drive out the vendors and livestock. Jesus spoke of destroying the temple and rebuilding it in three days. The Jews did not know Jesus was speaking of his body, but when his resurrection from the dead came to pass, his disciples remembered what Jesus had said and came to believe the Scripture and the word Jesus had spoken.




