Blue Light Special ...

Now don't laugh, but one of my favorite memories from childhood was having lunch with my Mom and Dad at the Kmart cafeteria. In the days when Woolworth's and Kmart were the discount stores in which to bargain-shop, my parents would always treat me to a grilled cheese, fries and chocolate milk after what seemed to be endless hours of looking though racks of clothing and shoes.

I'm sure the Kmart food was nothing to write home about, but to a 5-year-old, I loved sitting with my parents, our purchases surrounding us in the red plastic booth. Somehow, it made me feel very safe and happy sharing a meal and conversation about whatever was playing in my imagination at the time. In a way, it was rather "eucharistic" being there around that table: coming together as a family to be fed before we began the journey home.

This coming week we celebrate Thanksgiving as a nation, grateful for the many gifts our loving God has bestowed upon us. Despite the challenges and struggles that often arise in any family, there is always more that unites us than separates us, and we must never lose sight of that. That's why we gather around the Banquet Table of the Eucharist. 




