REFLECTION

December 14, 2025

A Rose By Any Other Name ...

One of the many things I love about the Catholic faith is that we embrace so many customs and traditions that have such symbolic meaning – things that “say” something sacred to us which then helps us live-out our love for Christ and His Church.

This third week of Advent, it's the lighting of the rose-colored candle and wearing the rose-colored vestment at Mass: a color that reminds us to be always joyful.

Isaiah tells us in our First Reading that all of nature will bloom and rejoice when they see the glory of God appear, and James writes that patient and firm hearts will rejoice in the presence of God. Even the psalmist tells us that we can rejoice in knowing that our God has indeed come to save us.

But what if you are feeling a little bah-humbug these days? What if you are stressed and anxious or tired and scared? Is it really possible to be joyful at all times?

I believe that the Lord would tell us it is possible. We can be joyful always, even when life doesn't seem to be going our way and the crosses we carry are heavy. Here's how: Take a page from John the Baptist's playbook and keep the focus on Christ as much as possible these remaining days leading-up to Christmas. John's entire life was attuned to the Savior's presence and voice, and John knew the Messiah would bring healing and holiness through the forgiveness of our sins (when we come to Him) and the conversion of our hardened hearts. Once we humbly open ourselves to that gift of Jesus' healing love, then Godly joy will flood the soul, even when the world around us still presents challenges and difficulties.

The Lord will come and save us. He is near. No wonder we light the rose candle to chase away the darkness.

Readings for Next Week: Fourth Sunday of Advent

First Reading: Isaiah 7:10-14

Ahaz receives from Isaiah a prophecy that he will be successful in war and is urged to ask for a sign that the prophecy is true. The sign is "The virgin shall be with child and bear a son, and shall name him Emmanuel."

Second Reading: Romans 1:1-7

Paul greets the Romans by pointing out that Jesus is the Christ who was promised to them in Scripture. He, Paul, is the apostle favored with the task of spreading the name of Christ to all.

Gospel: Matthew 1:18-24

In a brief, straightforward, simple narrative, Matthew recounts the events leading to Jesus' birth. He details the appearance of the angel in a dream to Joseph and stresses that "All this happened to fulfill what the Lord had said through the prophets."

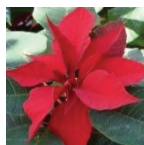
The Second & Final Advent Talk with Fr.

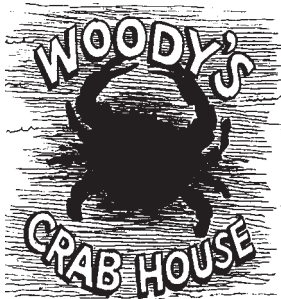

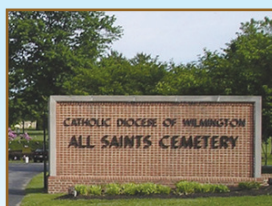

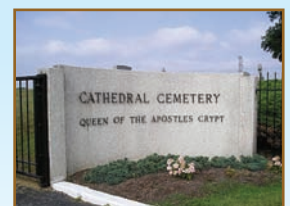
