Lessons Learned at the Family Dollar...

At Family Dollar the other day, Ms. Eleanor was holding-up the line (the only open lane that wasn't self-checkout). She didn't bring enough bags. The cashier, trying to be helpful – was putting as much as she could into the totes that Eleanor did bring. Just one problem: Eleanor couldn't carry them.

Turns out, Eleanor just turned 97.

"My son is usually with me to help," she told the cashier, "but he's really sick today so I have to take care of him." A mom never stops being a mom, do they?

So as Eleanor was trying to lift a bag of laundry detergent into her shopping cart, something so beautiful happened that it touched my heart profoundly. The people who had been impatiently waiting behind her now sprang into action.

One woman told the cashier to put the cost of some extra canvas bags on her own order, and then began to separate and lighten the weight of the paper bags Eleanor had in her cart. One young man offered to load the groceries into the back of her car, so she didn't have to lift them herself. And those in line who knew what was happening asked if she needed anything else: "Can you manage once you get home?" and "Do you want me to follow you to make sure you get home and into the house okay?"

Perfect strangers who in that moment came together to care for another person in need – the Gospel in action.

As we enter the 4th Sunday of Advent, may we reflect on the ways in which our small acts of loving kindness and generosity can change the world around us. Don't allow social media or the negative cultural voices which constantly bombard us with bad news make us see ourselves as self-centered or more than willing to shut others out if they don't think or vote like us. That just is not true.

Family Dollar and "never-give-up Eleanor" reminded me yet again that God-is-with-us (Emmanuel) every time we look out for and show respect toward those who cross our paths daily, even if for a brief moment. There are a million chances to do so.

Where will you find yours in these final days leading to Christmas?

Later, in another dream, an angel tells Joseph to go with Jesus and Mary to a town called Nazareth in the region of Galilee, thus fulfilling the Scriptures: "He shall be called a Nazarene."
