REFLECTION

Chalk It Up...

I recently visited a parishioner's home in which I was so happy to see the following description placed above their front door: 20+C+M+B+25. Although it is rare to come across this pattern of numbers, letters and symbols in Christian homes today, it is a powerful tradition that was once quite commonly used to celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany (or Three Kings Day).

If you have done this in your own homes, you will remember that the numbers at the beginning and the end represent the year; the crosses stand for Christ; and the letters have a two-fold significance: C, M and B are the initials of the traditional names of the Magi (Caspar, Melchior and Balthasar), but they are also an abbreviation of the Latin blessing *Christus mansionem benedicat*, which means: "May Christ bless this house." Some believe the Christian custom came from the Biblical precedent of the Israelites marking their doors to be kept safe from the Angel of Death.

Yet, there is also another beautiful meaning behind the chalk inscription as well. Just as the Holy Family showed loving hospitality to the Magi who had traveled from Gentile lands to honor the Christ Child, it also demonstrates a family's willingness to welcome all who come to visit as if that visitor were Christ Himself. By blessing our home, we are inviting God to enter and remain with us.

If you feel so led this Epiphany weekend, why not pick up a packet prepared by our Faith Formation Committee and inscribe in small characters above your front or back door: 20+C+M+B+26. In the New year, let Christ enter your home and your heart: He is the King of Glory.

On behalf of Fr. Dunne and Fr. Gebhart, Deacons Ben and Mike and our entire Immaculate Conception/St. Jude parish team, I wish you and your family a joy-filled and healthy 2026. May God be good to you.

Readings for Next Week: The Epiphany of the Lord

First Reading: Isaiah 60:1-6

Jerusalem is extolled as a place of glory and splendor because the Lord has come to His own city.

Second Reading: Ephesians 3:2-3a, 5-6

Paul tells the Ephesians that his special mission is to make the Gentiles co-heirs with the Jews in Christ — “members of the same body and sharers of the promise.”

Gospel: Matthew 2:1-12

Herod learns that Wise Men from the East are searching for the newly born Christ Child. He instructs them to find the Child and to report His whereabouts to him. The Wise Men follow a star to the place where Mary and Jesus are and offer the Child gold, frankincense, and myrrh. They do not return to Herod but follow another route to their own country.






