REFLECTION

December 7, 2025

It's Beginning to Look a Lot Like...

"Somehow I don't think this is what the Lord had in mind."

The woman who spoke these words was standing in front of me in line, her shopping cart filled with toys and other items to be wrapped and placed under the tree on Christmas morning. In front of her another customer was yelling at the cashier over the sale-price of the latest video game console. All the while, "Have a Holly Jolly Christmas" was blaring over the department store's sound system.

"Oh well, what can you do?" the woman said to no one in particular.

A monk living in upstate New York who has taken the name Brother Victor-Antoine points out that there are actually quite a few ways that one can enter the spirit of Christmas more peacefully by living Advent more intentionally. Nothing big, mind you. Instead, Brother offers this:

"By slowing down a little these next weeks, Christmas Day – and the entire season – will be more meaningful." He suggests a few possibilities for those of us who live in the world: be intentional about attending an extra daily Mass during Advent; read a verse of Scripture each day from the Gospel of Luke; pray the Angelus at noon and 6 p.m. (and 6 a.m. if you are awake); wait to listen to Christmas music until after the 3rd week of Advent; fast from something little each day until Christmas, including less time mindlessly scrolling on our phones; or just try to find a few extra moments of quiet and be dedicated to listening during your time set aside for prayer.

May our Advent season be filled with many little moments of stillness that will open-up within us hearts that are truly grateful and humble at Christmas and always.

As always, we will be regularly updating our website, TheDialog.org, on a daily basis through the holiday season.

The Dialog returns to print Friday, Jan. 9, 2026.

Please be generous when the **Retirement Fund for Religious collection** is taken in our parish the weekend of December 13/14.

In 2024, Catholics across the Diocese of Wilmington contributed \$129,873.49 to the collection, mostly through their home parishes. From the collection, the Capuchin Poor Clare Nuns; Little Sisters of Jesus and Mary; Oblate Sisters of St. Francis de Sales; and Oblates of St. Francis de Sales received a combined total of \$322,892.56 in financial assistance.

Rising health-care costs and the absence of traditional retirement plans have placed significant financial strain on many religious communities. The Retirement Fund for Religious helps address this need, supporting more than 21,000 religious over the age of 70. In 2024, the average annual cost of care was about \$56,600 per person, with skilled nursing care averaging \$96,000.






