No Bones About It...

This weekend after each Mass as well as on Tuesday, February 3 following daily Mass, parishioners will have the opportunity to have their throats blessed through the intercession of St. Blaise, a bishop and martyr of the early Church who, according to a pious legend, healed a child choking on a fish bone.

Whether true or not, the story speaks to the powerful intercession of the saints in our lives. As they now stand before the Throne of God in loving adoration, they also become our faithful cheering section (so to speak) as they want nothing more than for us to one day be where they are. The saints pray for us and with us, bringing our needs before Christ just as we do for others when they ask us to pray for them.

The journey to holiness is never easy and can only be accomplished through God's grace and the frequent reception of the Sacraments. However, it is also good to know that there is an entire army of saintly souls who are ready to step into the breach when we need them the most, bringing our needs before the Father. As a wise priest once told me: "Saints are in the business of caring for future saints."

The blessing of St. Blaise is a reminder that everything we care about – including our health – God cares about, too. That certainly brings me comfort. One could even say that it gets me a little "choked-up!" St. Blaise, pray for us (and for your pastor with the terrible puns).
