Make Me an Instrument...

It was in a “holler” about a half-hour outside of Charleston, West Virginia, where I first seriously thought about the priesthood. Along the banks of the Kanawha River sits a small Catholic chapel where a Franciscan priest ministers to his parishioners – most of them non-Catholic. When I met this friar during a week-long college service trip, I was taken by the ways in which he served the most-forgotten, the hungry, the lonely and those seeking a relationship with God. He listened and loved everyone who came to him, and nothing was too much trouble in service to the Kingdom.

Thirty years later, I no longer remember this priest’s name, but to me, he was a living witness to the revolution St. Francis of Assisi began in the 1200s, when his own calling to live the Gospel transformed him into the heart of Christ for a world that was often chasing other pursuits. I knew then that I wanted to be like this brown-robed Franciscan friar from West Virginia who showed me exactly who and what the Church is called to be as he lived his own vocation, simply and humbly, along the banks of the Kanawha.

At the start of 2026, Pope Leo XIV proclaimed a special Jubilee Year of St. Francis, marking the 800th anniversary of the saint’s death in 1226. This yearlong observance invites the faithful to foster peace, humility and healing for the created world while offering plenary indulgences to those who visit Franciscan sites, pray in the spirit of St. Francis, and perform daily acts of charity and humility.

Here at Immaculate Conception parish and St. Jude mission, so much of our own history has been shaped by the Sisters of St. Francis of Philadelphia at Glen Riddle, whose teaching charism and other ministries have touched countless lives and hearts in Cecil County and beyond. We are indebted to these Sisters for the ways in which they have shared (and continue to share) the love of the Good News of Jesus Christ with us.

Throughout the Jubilee year ahead, look for different opportunities here in our parish to learn more about and celebrate the life of St. Francis of Assisi, who would say to all he met: “God give you His peace.”

**Readings for Next Week:
Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

First Reading: Sirach 15:15-20

This passage from Sirach gives strong, unequivocal emphasis to free will in every person. Before each of us is set, sin or virtue, life or death, and each of us are free to choose the one or the other.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 2:6-10

Paul explains to the Corinthians that there are two different kinds of wisdom — the wisdom of God and the wisdom of the world. The wisdom of God is mysterious, but this wisdom has been revealed “to those who love him” through the Spirit.

Gospel: Matthew 5:17-37

In the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus tells the people he has come to fulfill the law. He speaks strongly against murder and anger, against adultery and lust, and against false oaths and lies. He warns the people that unless their virtue exceeds that of the Pharisees, they “will not enter the kingdom of God.”
