REFLECTION

Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

The Week We Call Holy...

There's a little boy living about 45 minutes north of here named Vincent. His parents and neighbors already call him "The Conqueror." At four months of age, he was diagnosed with brain cancer. Now at age 4, he has lymphoma. Just imagine what life must be like for that precious little boy and his family. The endless hospital stays. The sleepless nights. The agony of watching a little child suffer.

We will never really know this side of heaven why the crosses we carry are often so heavy, so frightening and so baffling. This I do know, however, and this week we call "holy" makes it abundantly clear: Instead of shaking our fists at a God who permits suffering to exist, might it not be better to see it all – especially the suffering and heartache we all face – through the lens of God's love?

A Love so strong, so real, and so complete that it risks all. Everything about this Passion Story – from Palm Sunday to Calvary -- is really the story of a God who suffered all that we would ever suffer and risked doing so out of love for us.

In every moment of this Holy Week journey, God risked putting His Sacred Heart out there for each one of us, knowing that it would often be ignored; spit-upon; mocked; and pierced. Not just during that one week two thousand years ago, but throughout all time. Pure love allowed itself to be beaten-up and weighed-down.

And the only reason I keep coming back to when I ask why He allowed this to happen to Him is this: From Calvary, He saw and loved 4-year-old Vincent and his parents in all that they now face. He saw your suffering and mine. He saw Iran and Israel and Gaza and Ukraine. And He saw those who come to our Outreach, seeking assistance and hope for a better tomorrow.

He saw us all – in our suffering and pain and heartache – and said to each one of us: I go to Calvary for you. I carry it for you. I endure it all for you. And I feel it ALL ...

Because I love you.

The reason to risk it all for love – that's Holy Week.

Please join us in the days ahead as we enter this most sacred time of our liturgical year. How beautiful it is when we come together as a parish community to worship our Lord, thank Him for His Sacrifice, and allow His Mercy to transform us.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul tells the Colossians that they will appear with Christ in glory. They should be mindful of things above rather than things on earth.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

In vivid detail, John tells us that when Mary Magdalene visited Christ's tomb, the tomb was empty. She told the apostles, who ran to the tomb, and saw the "wrappings" on the ground. The disciple who entered first "saw and believed."

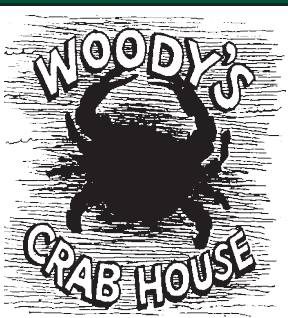

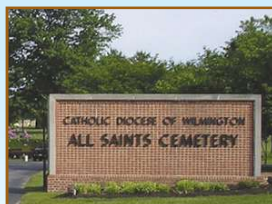
