REFLECTION

Third Sunday in Lent

He Ain't Heavy...

I recently led a Lenten parish mission for the soldiers, their families and the staff at Aberdeen Proving Grounds. In conversation with one serviceman about how faith and service to the country intersect, he shared very candidly with me that the most important thing he does, above all else, is pray every day for Christ's peace to reign in our hearts, our land and the world. He then adds: "I know I should fast, too, for this particular intention," he said, "but I am a sloppy faster. As disciplined as I am in the military, fasting is hard."

That's as honest a statement as I ever heard: "I am a sloppy faster." I don't know about you, but I often find the discipline of fasting during Lent a challenge. Abstaining from meat on Fridays is easy for most of us, I can imagine, especially when Woody's seafood and Maryland crab cakes are readily available. But intentionally going without something we truly enjoy – be it sweets or snacking between meals or mindlessly scrolling through social media – can be much more difficult. Yet, as we know, doing so can open up a holy space in our lives and hearts to make us more patient, compassionate and Christ-like.

It is also important to remember, too, that Lent isn't about our own individual spiritual journey; we spend this time together "in the desert" as a family of faith. Thus, our Lord will use the prayer and fasting efforts we offer on behalf of others (or upon some special concern we have) in order to allow His perfect will to find room in the life of the person or situation for whom we are fasting. Ultimately, the fast becomes the gift we offer to God for others.

As I was speaking with this soldier, I noticed the bulletin board on the wall behind us had a poster of one serviceman carrying another who had been wounded in battle. It was a powerful image of sacrifice and love in the time of war, and I realized that is exactly what we do for another when we pray and fast during this holy season of Lent, no matter how "sloppy" our efforts may be. May we strive to offer that gift as we approach the joy of Easter.
