REFLECTION

Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

Looking for the Son Rise...

When I lived in Wisconsin in my early 30s, I was invited to attend an ecumenical Easter Sunrise Service on Lake Michigan at an hour that was much too early for me at that stage of my life. Having attended the Easter Vigil, the evening before at the local Catholic Church, I was especially tired as I made my way in the dark to the rocky shoreline where families had already begun gathering. In my head, the thought kept returning: "Why did I say 'yes' to this?"

Thankfully, there was an air of joyful expectation despite the hour of the morning, and it was a blessing to witness so many families come with their children to spend some time in prayer with the local community before returning home to explore Easter baskets (or go back to bed). For many, this was the one time of year that they worshipped in any formal way.

As we were waiting the sky to brighten, a local Christian band from the Methodist Church in Racine began playing the instrumental version of "Here Comes the Sun" (with an obvious play on words) – except, we all knew by that point that this was the furthest thing from the truth. At that very moment, as if on cue, it started to drizzle lightly.

Apparently, it was unexpected, for no one brought rain jackets or umbrellas. And so, we stood huddled along Lake Michigan, disappointed and cold and wet as the preacher shouted through the sound system: "This is the day the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad!" Some of us burst out laughing at that.

But then he continued: "My friends, just as we weren't expecting the rain, the first disciples of Jesus weren't expecting the brutality of Calvary, either. They were disappointed and angry and scared that first Easter morning. But like Mary Magdalen at the tomb, they never completely lost hope in Him. And in that hopeful search – even if it was shrouded by grief – the risen Christ came to them and loved them in that exact place of searching."

He then ended with this: "Keep looking for the sun – and the SON – amidst the storm, for both have risen, even if we can't always see it or feel it from where we stand."

Beautiful advice that I have never forgotten. May we all hold fast to the constant love of the Risen Christ no matter what we might be facing in the present moment of our life's journey. Our Lord is always present to us, and for this we must rejoice and be glad.

On behalf of our priests, deacons and parish staff at Immaculate Conception and St. Jude mission church, may you and your loved ones know the joy of Easter hope today and always. He is Risen indeed. Alleluia!

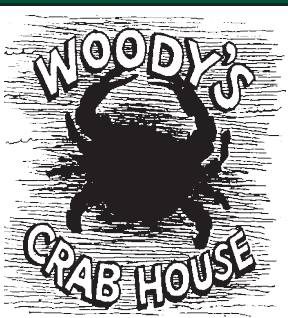

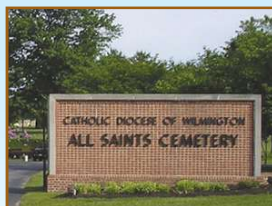

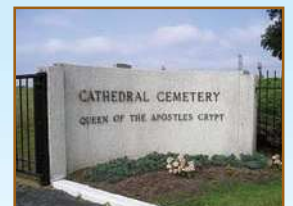
