The Witness of Blake

There's a video clip that the network news stations have picked-up, one which shows a 5-year-old boy named Blake who spent months learning to use a walker in order to process across the stage at a pre-school graduation in order to receive his diploma. Blake was diagnosed with spina bifida at birth and has been through many recent surgeries, so every step he makes is obviously quite a challenge for him.

Watching the smile on his face as he made his way across the stage that morning, I can't help but be deeply moved by both his own determination and the love of so many people who helped him achieve his goal. His parents, of course, were over-the-moon ecstatic with his successful journey, but so too were his teachers, his physical therapists and even his fellow 5-year-old classmates. Blake walked across that stage for them as much as he did for himself.

Graduation season is now upon us, and many of our teen and college-aged parishioners are looking forward to beginning new journeys ahead. Like Blake, may they never be afraid to challenge themselves to reach the goals that they have set, no matter how many setbacks and falls may come their way. Quite frankly, this is the very message that the Lord offered to his own disciples before he ascended into heaven: Be witnesses. Persevere. The Holy Spirit will be with you always.

Knowing this, may our graduates (and all of us) also be truly grateful for the countless others who walk with us on our journey in life, helping us become the virtuous and holy women and men our Lord is inviting us to be. As German theologian Meister Eckhart once said: "If the only prayer you ever say is 'Thank You,' it will be enough."

Many blessings on this Ascension Sunday to young Blake and all our graduates. Be grateful, persevere, and stay open to the presence of God on the incredible journey that awaits you!

Visitors from many different countries were amazed that each guest could hear his or her native language being spoken as the disciples proclaimed God's glory.

Jubilee of Hope Cross - Pope Francis declared 2025 a Jubilee Year calling us to be "Pilgrims of Hope." As part of our parish response on Trinity Sunday (June 15th), we will bless a cross which will be placed near the main entrance inside each church.

Our cross will display the word HOPE and be draped with the liturgical season colors as we move from Easter to Ordinary Time to Advent to Christmas. In the box at the base of the cross will be Pope Francis' Jubilee Prayer cards. We are encouraged to pray this daily.

A basket with footprint-shaped prayer slips will also be available in which all will be encouraged to write prayer intentions and place them in the box at the HOPE Cross. Prayers are our way of communication with Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, the blessed Trinity. We offer praise to our God, our Everything. We offer thanksgiving to Him for blessings received. We petition His guidance when we are not sure of the best option. We seek forgiveness when we realize we have disappointed Him. Prayer is so many things!

At the end of this Jubilee of Hope Year, ending on December 28th, we will burn all our prayer slips in a small ceremony closing out the year.

In addition, there are officially designated Jubilee of Hope shrines in our country. One, is St. John Neumann Shrine in Philadelphia. Another site is the National Shrine of St. Rita of Cascia in Philadelphia. Look for details in our bulletin of a November bus trip to this location sponsored by Holy Family Parish.

Wellness Tip: It's Tick Time! Lyme Disease is very common in our area and is caused by the bacteria from a tick commonly called a deer tick. It's a small black legged tick ranging from the size of a pencil point to the pencil's eraser. Prevention is best! If in a grassy or wooded area, wear insect repellent, light colored clothing to easily spot a tick and do tick checks of your body each evening. If found, remove immediately.

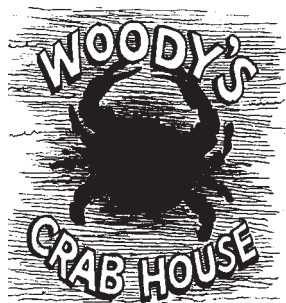

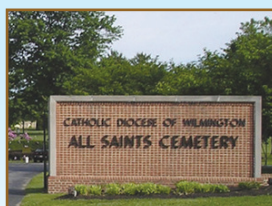

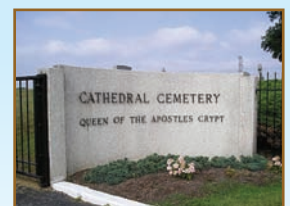
