REFLECTION

The Most Holy Body And Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi)

The Greatest Gift

As we prepare to conclude the three-year National Eucharistic Revival here in the United States, it is always good to look back at some of the many blessings and spiritual fruits that have come from the bishops' initiative. Thousands of fallen-away Catholics have returned to the faith; last year's National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis attracted 60,000 Catholics, many of them teens and young adults; even now, pilgrims are carrying the Blessed Sacrament in sacred procession through the streets of American cities, asking the Lord's blessing to reach souls who hunger for His healing, mercy and love.

I have been fortunate these past three years to offer presentations from time to time on the Lord's Presence in the Eucharist, and specifically, how receiving Communion and spending time in Eucharistic Adoration can change lives and hearts. Quite often, the young people with whom I meet have offered these thoughts on how the Eucharist fills every one of their heart's hungers:

- 1) Christ's presence in the Most Blessed Sacrament brings unity from division, for it is the tangible reminder that we are all one in Him.
- 2) We hunger for Truth, and Jesus Christ is that Truth we all seek – whether we know it or not.
- 3) Christ in the Eucharist is the Divine Healer: "Come to Me, all who labor and are burdened ..."
- 4) His Presence remains with us in order to guide the lost and forsaken, and move us forward in hope.
- 5) Eucharistic Adoration reminds us of our longing for beauty, quiet and rest. (This is a popular one!)
- 6) Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament connects us to the saints in heaven, and receiving Him worthily makes us saints, too.
- 7) Lastly, according to a third-grade student from Easton, MD: "The Eucharist is Love, and Jesus' Love is always here for us." (I couldn't have said it any better myself!)

As we celebrate Corpus Christi Sunday this weekend, may we renew our own reverence for the Lord's Presence in the Holy Eucharist. *If you are able, please join us after the 11 am Mass this Sunday at Immaculate Conception as we process with the Blessed Sacrament through our campus property, asking our Lord to protect our families, neighbors and the county we love.* Let us never lose that desire to spend time with Him in liturgy, prayer and adoration.

May the Heart of Jesus in the Most Blessed Sacrament be praised, adored and loved, with grateful affection, at every moment, in all the Tabernacles of the world, even until the end of time. Amen.

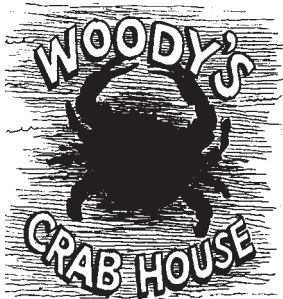

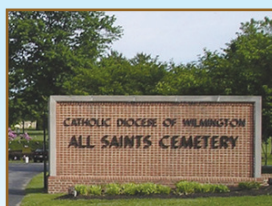

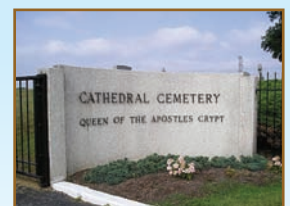
