REFLECTION

250 Reasons to Celebrate ...

This coming Saturday, countless Americans will take part in 4th of July festivities that mark the day which celebrates the publication of our nations' Declaration of Independence from Great Britain in 1776.

While I was growing up, my father would drag us to the local neighborhood parade filled with high school marching bands, fire trucks, winning Little League teams and Irish dancers. Occasionally a local Philly TV celebrity from the 1950s and '60s would show-up to be the grand marshal, like the time a much older "Chief Halftown" and "Our Gal Sally Starr" came charging-in on the back of a Mustang (4-wheels, of the Ford variety). My Dad still talks about that day as if it were the best thing that ever happened in our sleepy suburb. (It might actually have been!)

The other local notables who often made an appearance were the group of rabbis and Christian pastors – including the Catholic priests – who would walk the parade route together, not waving any religious flags or throwing candy to the crowds but simply there to witness. Although I thought it corny when I was younger, I now understand that their presence was a reminder to all who lined the parade route that the freedom to worship is just as important as any other freedoms we cherish as a nation. Those men and women in clerical garb pointed to the fact that we as a Church should also have a voice in society and a place at the national table, and no government can ever take that freedom to worship away from us.

Unfortunately, I haven't been back to my hometown parade in years (and I hear fewer and fewer turn out for it), but I do hope the current priests, pastors and rabbis still march the same route together. It is an important witness to a founding ideal that our nation must never forget.

May our Lord and His Blessed Mother continue to bless and intercede for our beloved country. Happy 250th, America!
