The Unexpected Kindness of Strangers

I met some teacher friends for dinner at a local diner right before the July 4th holiday weekend; it was long overdue, and so good to see them again in-person. As I had just come from an anointing at the hospital, I was still dressed in my clerics.

When we were given the check, the waitress told us: "Your bill has been paid for. Stay as long as you want."

Surprised and deeply touched by the kindness of a stranger, we looked around to see who it could have possibly been. "Someone was just being nice because they know you're a priest," said one of my former co-workers. Perhaps that was true, I thought.

But God always has a way of surprising us, doesn't He?

When the three of us were leaving, we thanked the waitress and asked her to pass along our appreciation to the one who provided for our meals.

"I'll do that, hon," she said, and then added: "Remember the family that sat across from you when you first arrived? They come here every week and pay for a random table's meal. They started doing it a few years ago after Covid as a way to pay it forward. There's too much hate and unkindness in the world these days, you know? They said that they just try to add a little happiness to someone else's day."

When I think about the family that sat across from us that night, I would have wrongly judged (I am ashamed to admit) that they – of all the diner patrons present – would have been the ones to pay for a stranger's meal. You just never know what's in another's heart, do you?

As we were walking out the door, the waitress added: "It really doesn't take much to make someone else happy, does it?"

It certainly doesn't.

Who knew that the Lord could use a rather non-descript diner on a quiet Thursday evening in early July to teach me quite a few lessons about living and giving to others with a generous, non-judgmental heart ...
