REFLECTION

The Trouble Tree

A good friend just shared this story with me (author unknown), and I thought it offered some food for thought when the troubles of the world and work weigh us down. The story is told from a homeowner's perspective:

"I hired a plumber to help restore an old farmhouse I had recently purchased. On the day he started our job, he found out that much of the piping he ordered had been stolen from his shop and one of his employees didn't show up for work. What's more, his favorite drill quit working, and his truck wouldn't start when he was ready to head home for the day.

As I gave him a lift back to his house, he sat in stony silence, but on our arrival he invited me to stop in and meet his family. As we walked toward the front door, he paused briefly at a small maple tree, touching the tip of the branches with both hands.

As the plumber opened the door to his home, he underwent an amazing transformation. His face was one big smile as he hugged his young children and greeted his wife with a kiss on the cheek. As he walked me back to the car after our brief time chatting inside, we passed the tree, and my curiosity got the best of me. I asked about what I saw him do earlier.

'Oh, that's my trouble tree,' he said. 'I know I can't help having bad moments at work, but those troubles don't belong in the house with my wife and kids. So, I just hang them on the tree every night when I come home and ask God to take care of them. Then, in the morning, I pick them up again. Funny thing: when I pick them up the next day, there aren't nearly as many as I remember hanging up the night before."

Not a bad idea, perhaps, to find our own "trouble tree," whatever that may be for you or me. When we give our worries and troubles to the Lord each day in prayer, He does take care of them, and works all things out according to His Will.

And Jesus said: "Ask and you will receive; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you."


