REFLECTION

The Heart of Our Mother

We Catholics love our feast days and liturgical seasons: the purples of Lent and Advent; the octave of Christmas; the solemn Holy Week liturgies; and the days honoring Mary and the saints who are special to us. These times and seasons remind us that although we are firmly planted in the world, we are called as a Church to make our days sacred by how we live our faith as we journey together toward God.

I am still learning, even now, some of the more unique celebrations established on our Church's calendar. For example, I found out just the other day that the entire month of August is dedicated to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. I knew from my Catholic school upbringing that October is traditionally dedicated to praying the Most Holy Rosary and that there are other holy days scattered throughout the calendar which honor our Blessed Mother. But who knew there was an entire month dedicated to her most pure and beautiful Heart?

Traditionally, devotion to the Immaculate Heart comes from Luke's Gospel, in which Mary is told by the prophet Simeon that a sword would pierce her heart due to her Son's mission. In that same chapter, it is written that Mary "held all these things in her heart." We know, of course, that her Son's life, death and resurrection are at the core of her pondering heart. At the same time, there is something quite beautiful and comforting knowing that we are also the ones she holds there most dearly. Our own worries, doubts, fears, sorrows and even our joys are absorbed into her Heart, and it is there where she holds them for us and intercedes for us in these moments.

Recently, the Bishop of Wichita, Kansas, encouraged his diocese to return to Our Lady's Immaculate Heart by praying the Rosary every day in August for peace and healing in our nation and world, and for an increase in holy vocations. Why not consider doing the same as our sisters and brothers are doing in Wichita? And if a Rosary seems to be a little too much for your daily schedule, then even a decade a day (1 Our Father and 10 Hail Mary's along with 1 Glory Be) is a great way to stay connected to Our Blessed Mother in prayer. After all, a Mother's heart always has room for all her children ... and there is nowhere else Mary would want us to be.


