Grace in the Recliner

Sometimes you can't help but see the hand of God at work.

Just the other day, a call came-in from a family seeking Last Rites for their father. To be honest, I never know what I will find in such situations, so I often pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy on my way to the hospital or the family's home both for the person I am about to meet as well as for the wisdom to know what to say and the courage to enter the suffering.

In most cases, the parishioner with whom I am praying is often days, if not hours, away from dying. Although he or she may not be able to respond, I do believe the soul "hears" the prayers and absorbs the graces that come through the Sacrament of Anointing. Quite beautifully, many families have witnessed the peace that comes after such sacred moments.

When I arrived at the home of the man in need of Last Rites, I was surprised to find the patriarch of the family sitting in his well-worn leather recliner, surrounded by his children and grandchildren. He was clearly suffering, but he was also quite alert and receptive to the love that his family was showering upon him. You could see in his expression how grateful he was to have the Church come to him in his hour of need. "Father, I have been faithful all my life," he told me, "and to know that Jesus has come when I need Him the most ..."

There wasn't a dry eye in the living room at that moment.

Then, after a period in which his family stepped out so that I could hear his confession if he so desired, they returned to pray with their father as I offered the Sacrament to him. Watching him receive the Eucharist – quite possibly for the last time this side of heaven – was enough to make even the most hardened heart break open to the love of God that longs for each of us. I can't describe it any other way than to say that we were all witnessing in that room a truly holy death, and those children and grandchildren were being shown in one final lesson how to live and how to die gracefully (filled with grace).

As I was leaving the home that late morning, one of the man's grandsons came running after me as I made my way back to my car. "Father, it's been a while since I have been to Church. Do you have a minute to talk?"

Undoubtedly, his grandfather would be so very proud ...

First Reading: Isaiah 66:18-21

Isaiah portrays a time when people from many nations will gather in Jerusalem and proclaim God's glory. God's messengers will teach many nations about God. Just as the Israelites bring offerings, these messengers will bring people from all nations to worship.

Second Reading: Hebrews 12:5-7, 11-13

The Hebrews are told that God disciplines those he loves. When a parent disciplines a child, the child usually learns what is expected of him. The Hebrews are encouraged to face life's trials as a form of discipline, and attempt to learn something from them.

Gospel: Luke 13:22-30

Jesus warns that the door to God's kingdom will be locked for those who ignored his wishes. Many people will come from all nations and take their place in God's kingdom. Others will not be recognized by God, and he will reject them.

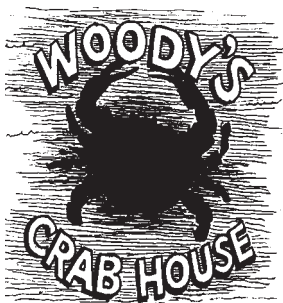

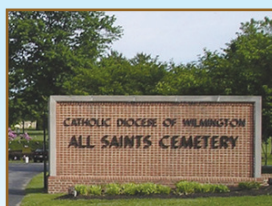

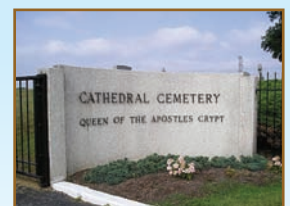
