Pick Up the Chalk ...

“Just pick-up the hunk of chalk as much as possible and love them like Jesus.”

So was the advice my first principal offered me in the days before I began teaching middle school back in September 2001. I was nervous and excited all at the same time – mostly nervous, though, to be honest. I wasn’t sure if I had what it took to reach the young minds and hearts that would soon sit (in alphabetical order) before me.

Sister’s words came flooding back this past week as I was asked to lead the opening retreat for the 60 new teachers of the Catholic schools of our diocese. I had originally planned to lead with a different story that morning, but for whatever reason at the last minute, I led with Sister’s advice to me instead. I hoped it would be inspirational, but didn’t dwell on it too long in my opening remarks. I had moved on to other topics.

It never ceases to amaze me, though, how the Holy Spirit works so powerfully in moments such as these. As I was preparing to leave the retreat that day, a brand-new teacher from a suburban grade school approached me and was candid enough to share with me what was happening in his life. “I came here this morning planning on backing out, and I was calling the principal later today to tell her I had changed my mind. I didn’t feel I was ready to teach; I even wrote my letter of resignation.”

He continued: “But all morning, I couldn’t stop thinking about your first principal’s advice. I made up my mind that I am going to give it a try after all: I can pick-up the chalk and love them.” And then, he smiled a genuine smile: “Even though we don’t use chalk anymore!”

As our schools begin to reopen for another academic year, please hold in prayer the teachers who sacrifice so much to bring the gift of faith and a solid education to our young people. These women and men in our classrooms (at every level) light the way for our children as they make their way in this world, fortified by truth and compassion. How blessed our schools are to have such faithful witnesses to God’s love, and we thank them for all they do for our young people and their families ... even if they don’t pick up the hunk of chalk anymore!






