As we wrap-up the unofficial end to the summer season and return to the more- hectic pace of life that September often brings, I wanted to take this opportunity to update you on the "State of the Parish," so to speak. Many good things have occurred here lately, and many more are in the works:

- Thanks to Don Harmer, Joe Bench and the Buildings and Maintenance committee who worked tirelessly for more than a year to get the septic system and parking lot at St. Jude's completed. I never thought I would be so thrilled to see new blacktop and actual parking spaces! To those who contributed financially to this costly project, we are grateful.
- Two boilers need to be replaced in the parish center and the school. Work begins soon.
- Future projects also include: repointing the parish center and replacement of the aging carpet in our parish meeting rooms, as well as an improved sound system in the church and chapel.

Our parish's Summer Academy was a great success as well, with nearly double the number of participants this year. Despite the record-breaking heat, catechists and volunteers showed-up in countless ways to guarantee our young people had wonderful encounters with the Lord and this Church community. In the months ahead, look for the new and exciting approaches to youth ministry at ICC:

- The EDGE program: an opportunity for middle-school students to connect more deeply with one another and their faith.
- Monthly high school youth group gatherings in our newly-renovated youth room
- Exciting opportunities for our Confirmation candidates to grow in faith
- Continued quarterly socials and prayer experiences at St. Jude's for our young families
- Academy Card events throughout the year inviting students and parents to come together to learn about Catholic traditions and prayers.

As we offered "Happy Retirement" wishes in July to Dotty Fritz after three decades of selfless service to our Outreach program, I am happy to report that the ministry will continue under the combined guidance of Liz Orr and Paul Kough. Special thanks, too, to Julie Schmitt and her team of faithful volunteers for all they do day-in and day-out for those most in need in Cecil County.

Finally, please remember to join us in the traditional ways we gather in fellowship and prayer to support our beloved community: the Golf Outing (September 15); the Respect Life Mass (October 4); the Knights of Columbus Oktoberfest (October 19) and the Christmas Bazaar (November 8). We are always looking for new volunteers, so don't hesitate to jump-in and help out.

On a personal note, I am grateful for your continued prayerful support and understanding as I continue to oversee Good Shepherd parish and its missions in the absence of their pastor. Continue to pray for Fr. Jay that he will return to them soon in good health. I pray for you each day and hold you in my heart as I celebrate Eucharist. Readings for Next Week:
Twenty-Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

First Reading: Wisdom 9:13-18b

This reading acknowledges that people have had a difficult time attempting to know God's wishes. At times we have difficulty understanding the things that happen on earth. Therefore, learning of things in heaven would have been impossible, except that God sent us wisdom and the Holy Spirit to help us understand him.

Second Reading: Philemon 9-10, 12-17

Paul writes to Philemon regarding Onesimus, a slave who ran away and encountered Paul. Although Paul wished Onesimus could remain with him, he did not want to violate Philemon's wishes. Paul asks that Philemon receives his friend Onesimus as a beloved brother, not as a slave. He closes by saying, "Welcome him as you would me."

Gospel: Luke 14:25-33

Jesus warns people who wish to follow him that they must abandon everyone else first. A person calculates the amount of money needed to complete a project before they begin it. In the same way, Jesus warns these people to consider exactly what is involved before they make a commitment to follow him.

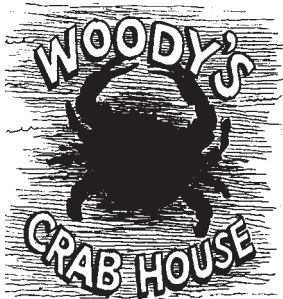

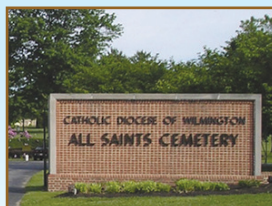

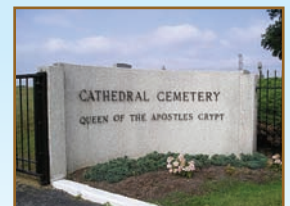
